KADUNA'S DATA-DRIVEN EDUCATION REFORMS: A MODEL FOR TACKLING OUT-OF-SCHOOL CHILDREN IN NORTHERN NIGERIA

The future of any nation is determined by the quality of investment it makes in its children. No country can achieve sustainable development, economic growth or social stability if a large percentage of its young population remains outside the classroom, without skills, healthcare and opportunities.

This is why the efforts of the Kaduna State Government in tackling the challenge of out-of-school children deserve serious national attention. At a time when Nigeria continues to battle one of the world's largest populations of children outside formal education, Kaduna's approach offers an important lesson for other states facing similar challenges. UNICEF estimates that Nigeria has more than 20 million primary school-age children out of school, making education access one of the country's biggest development challenges.

What distinguishes Kaduna from many other states is that it has adopted a data-driven approach to addressing the crisis. Rather than relying solely on projections and broad estimates, the state has invested in understanding not only how many children are out of school, but also who they are, where they are located and, most importantly, why they are not in school. This evidence-based approach enables government to design targeted interventions, deploy resources more efficiently and continuously measure the impact of its policies.

The recently validated Kaduna State Out-of-School Children Mapping Exercise exemplifies this approach. The exercise, arguably one of the most comprehensive household-level education mapping exercises undertaken by any state in Nigeria, visited more than 360,319 households across all 23 Local Government Areas and identified 187,720 out-of-school children between the ages of 6 and 17 years. Unlike conventional sample surveys, the exercise achieved near-total household coverage, providing community-level evidence that now guides education planning and resource allocation.

The findings are particularly significant when viewed alongside previous estimates. UNICEF estimated Kaduna's out-of-school population at approximately 730,000 children in 2022,

while projections by the Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics in 2023 placed the figure at about 535,000. The latest household mapping exercise identified 187,720 out-of-school children. Although these figures were generated using different methodologies and should not be interpreted as exact like-for-like comparisons, they nevertheless demonstrate a clear downward trajectory. The trend reflects the cumulative impact of sustained education reforms undertaken by the Kaduna State Government. At the same time, the Government recognises that the work is far from complete. The objective is not merely to reduce the numbers, but ultimately to ensure that every school-age child is enrolled in a safe, inclusive and quality learning environment.

The scale of the challenge has required equally ambitious action. Over the past three years, the Kaduna State Government has pursued one of Nigeria's most comprehensive education reform agendas, combining policy reforms, institutional strengthening, digital innovation and strategic investments to tackle the root causes of educational exclusion.

Hundreds of classrooms have been constructed and rehabilitated, teaching and learning materials distributed to schools, school fee waivers introduced across public institutions, teacher welfare significantly improved—including the extension of the retirement age for teachers—and education planning strengthened through better data systems and improved governance. Collectively, these reforms have improved access to education, enhanced learning conditions and restored public confidence in the education sector.

Complementing these reforms is the Reaching Out-of-School Children (ROOSC) Project, Nigeria's flagship programme dedicated exclusively to tackling the out-of-school children challenge through a holistic, systems-based approach. The

four-year programme is being implemented by the Kaduna State Government in partnership with the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB), Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED), Global Partnership for Education (GPE), Education Above All (EAA), Save the Children International and UNICEF, with a combined financing envelope of approximately US\$62.85 million.

Unlike many education interventions that focus on a single challenge, the ROOSC Project addresses three interconnected pillars. The first focuses on expanding equitable access to education through the construction and rehabilitation of schools and learning centres where infrastructure gaps exist. The second pillar seeks to improve the quality of learning through teacher development, provision of teaching and learning materials, inclusive education and improved learning outcomes. The third pillar strengthens the education system itself through better planning, digital data systems, monitoring, institutional capacity and governance to ensure that improvements remain sustainable long after the project is completed.

The importance of this intervention therefore extends beyond getting children into classrooms. The real measure of success will be whether these children receive quality education that prepares them for productive lives.

Nigeria's education challenge has never been only about access. It is equally about learning outcomes, teacher quality, infrastructure and curriculum relevance. A child who enters school but leaves without literacy, numeracy or practical skills is still being denied the full benefits of education.

This is precisely why Kaduna's broader approach, which combines basic education, vocational education, child protection and healthcare, is particularly significant.

Recent findings from the household mapping exercise further demonstrate that educational exclusion is driven by multiple factors. Economic constraints account for nearly 59 per cent of the barriers preventing children from attending school, while deficiencies within the education system account for another 26 per cent.

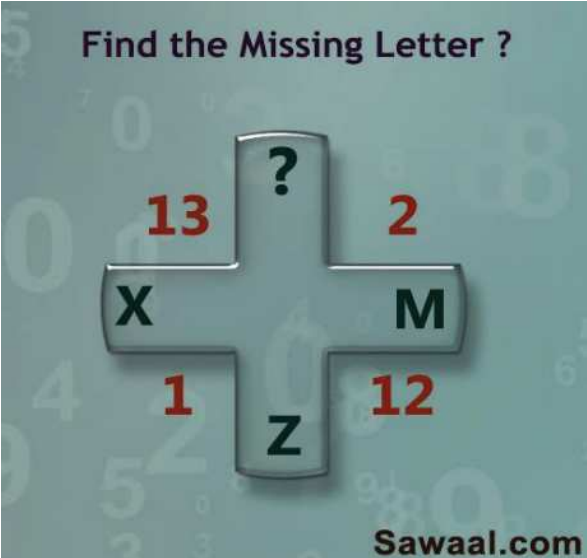

■ Senate Leader, Opeyemi Bamidele, has promised to strengthen the quality representation being offered Ekiti state citizens at the Senate, if he emerges victorious in the 2027 senatorial election to be conducted by the Independent National Electoral Commission(INEC). Bamidele, who is the All Progressives Congress (APC) senatorial candidate in Ekiti Central, pledged to fortify the beneficial and mutually inclusive synergy he has built with Governor Biodun Oyeibanji to transform the state in terms of infrastructures, unity of purpose and expansion of politics of solidarity that can uplift the lives of the citizens. 14

■ The Nigeria Democratic Congress (ADC) has uploaded the particulars of its presidential candidate, Peter Obi, to the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) portal. The national leader of the NDC, Seriake Dickson, made this known on his 'X' handle. In the post, Dickson said: "The name of the vice presidential candidate would be uploaded after the completion of the required documentation, while the submission of candidates for other elective positions was also ongoing." 15

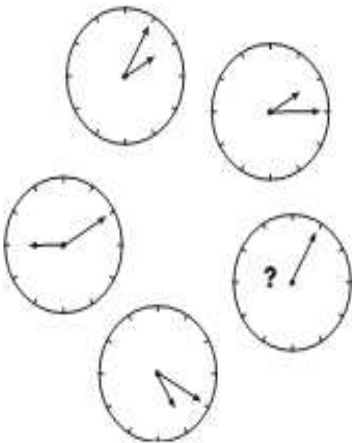
Crack the Missing Letter Puzzle?

■ A coalition of civil society groups led by the Centre for Social Justice (CSJ), has called on the leadership of the National Assembly to engage President Bola Ahmed Tinubu over his continued withholding of assent to the Federal Audit Service Bill, months after it was transmitted to him for signing. In a letter addressed to the Senate President, Godswill Akpabio, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and other principal officers of the National Assembly, the Lead Director of CSJ, Eze Onyekpere, said the President had neither assented to the Bill nor made public any communication stating his reasons for declining to sign it. **20**

■ Nigeria's private sector growth slowed in June as the headline purchasing managers' index (PMI) declined to 53.4 in June, down slightly from May's reading of 54.1, according to S&P Global/Stanbic IBTC report for June. According to June Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) report, improving demand conditions helped to support further increases in output and new orders in Nigeria's private sector at the midway point of the year. **20**

■ South Africa recorded a preliminary trade deficit of R1.8 billion in May as exports declined and imports increased, according to the latest preliminary trade statistics released by the South African Revenue Service (SARS). This is coming at a time where xenophobic activities seem to be weighing down on South Africa. Analysts say South Africa is actively facing severe economic backlash from anti-migrant campaigns and "foreigner must go" protests. **21**

■ The Nigerian National Petroleum Company (NNPC) Limited has recorded a robust financial performance for the month of May 2026, posting a revenue of N4,335 billion and a Profit After Tax (PAT) of N462 billion. According to the company's monthly Report Summary released on Wednesday, the state-owned oil firm also remitted a cumulative sum of N4,858 billion in statutory payments to the Federation Account between January and May 2026, solidifying its position as a major contributor to national revenue. **21**

US-IRAN WAR: BLOODSHED, DIALOGUE, AND ACCENTUATED LESSONS

If all wars end in dialogue, why begin with bloodshed? On June 18, 2026, after nearly four months of escalating hostilities that threatened to ignite a wider war in the Middle East, representatives of the United States and Iran signed what is now known as the Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding. Brokered largely through Pakistani mediation and backed by a coalition of international actors, the agreement brought a fragile halt to a conflict that had drawn in Israel, shaken global markets, disrupted energy supplies, and left thousands of people dead across several countries. At that meeting in Islamabad, diplomats smiled cautiously for the cameras, while politicians spoke of peace, stability, and mutual commitments. Yet, beyond the ceremony and diplomatic niceties, a more profound question lingered: If virtually every war ends around a negotiating table, why do nations so often choose the battlefield first?

This question extends far beyond the latest confrontation involving Washington, Tehran and Tel Aviv; it echoes through the ruins of Ukraine, across the refugee camps of Sudan, through the memories of Biafra, and into communities across Nigeria still grappling with the consequences of insurgency, banditry and communal violence. It also grows more urgent with each passing decade as warfare becomes more technologically sophisticated, more economically disruptive, and, paradoxically, less capable of delivering lasting political solutions. The conflict that culminated in the Islamabad agreement began with familiar justifications, as US President Donald Trump emphasised regional security concerns and Iran's nuclear capabilities. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu then framed military actions as necessary for national survival and regional stability. Consequently, Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian and senior Iranian officials maintained that their military response was a strategic defence of national sovereignty and resistance to external aggression. Each side had a reason to strike, speaking the language of necessity and believing their actions were more justified than those of the

opponents. This is how wars begin.

The First World War started on July 28, 1914, and was expected to end by Christmas of that year, but it lasted four more years, finally ending on November 11, 1918, when Germany signed an armistice with the Allies in Compiègne, France. The United States entered Vietnam in 1955, confident that military dominance would quickly contain communism, but the war continued until the Paris Peace Accords in 1975, 20 years after the war commenced. Similarly, Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 was anticipated to resolve quickly, within weeks, but the conflict has persisted far longer than expected. It has resulted in hundreds of thousands of deaths and injuries, displaced millions, devastated entire cities, and caused economic impacts far beyond Eastern Europe. Deaths are still being counted, along with devastation, uncertainty, fear, and anxiety.

This same pattern unfolded in the Middle East during the current US-Iran conflict. What began as a strategic confrontation soon evolved into a humanitarian and economic disaster, whose effects are still being

felt well beyond the immediate combat zones. The closure and disruption of shipping routes through the Strait of Hormuz, a narrow waterway through which roughly one-fifth of global oil trade passes, transformed the regional conflict into a global concern. Once maritime traffic became uncertain, energy markets reacted almost immediately, with oil prices skyrocketing, disrupting global economic activity and market investments. In Nigeria, and across Africa, economists warned of renewed inflationary pressures, with businesses already struggling with high operating costs and market volatility. Developing economies dependent on imported energy products found themselves particularly vulnerable.

For ordinary citizens, the impact was neither abstract nor theoretical. When energy prices rise, transportation becomes more expensive, which, in turn, increases food prices and reduces food availability and accessibility — because household purchasing power declines as food prices rise. The chain reaction affects everyone, from the farmer transporting produce to the market, to the teacher and civil servants paying transport fares, to the family struggling to keep food on the table. Ironically, while various governments are spending billions to finance military operations, millions of ordinary people around the world worry about the cost of bread, cooking oil, school fees, and healthcare.

Preliminary assessments show that the sheer financial waste of the US-Iran conflict defies comprehension: a staggering \$2 billion per day was burned on military operations alone — wealth that a senior UN official noted could have otherwise provided life-saving aid for more than 87 million people. Instead, it was spent on an asymmetric arms race where a \$20,000 kamikaze drone (by Iran) was hunted down by a \$4 million interceptor missile (of the US or Israel), compounding a massive global economic drag that experts estimate will cost individual households thousands of dollars in macroeconomic fallout. In a world where nearly 700 million people still experience extreme poverty,

the spectacle of nations spending billions each day to destroy each other's infrastructure inevitably raises uncomfortable moral questions.

Calculating the economic costs of a US-Iran war is difficult. The total cost depends on three factors: direct military spending, economic damage, and broader global impacts. For the USA, early estimates from the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) put the first 100 hours of operations at about \$3.7 billion. CSIS later estimated that costs had reached about \$11.3 billion by day six and \$16.5 billion by day 12. Iran has suffered extensive damage to its infrastructure and economy. Recent reporting cites war-related damage of around \$270 billion, with major energy-sector repairs still needed. Civilian casualties, displacement, and damage to industry and oil facilities add to the economic burden.

Yet, even these extraordinary financial costs tell only part of the story, as the deeper tragedy lies in the human consequences. Early reports from the conflict indicate that between 7,500 and 10,000 people may have lost their lives across several countries. Lebanese authorities reported more than 3,700 fatalities amid military operations that displaced hundreds of thousands of people, while Iranian officials reported over 3,400 deaths, including military commanders, government officials, and civilians. Additional casualties were recorded in Israel, Iraq, the United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, and among American military personnel deployed in the region. In Iran, joint US-Israeli bombings obliterated critical civilian infrastructure — destroying at least 30 schools, shattering water pipelines, and damaging 240 medical facilities, 54 museums, and five UNESCO World Heritage sites — while retaliatory Iranian strikes tore through airports, hotels, and oil infrastructure across the Gulf states.

As we celebrate the end of the US-Iran war, we must analyse the lessons learned and the factors responsible for the staggering loss of life and property caused by this senseless war. The world cannot afford a repeat of such a scenario, for it is an ill wind that blows nobody any good. To be continued next week.

Curbing perennial building collapse

Although incidents of building collapse have become common occurrences in the country in recent years, the latest tragedies recorded in Port Harcourt and Lagos a few days ago and within an interval of 24 hours call for desperate measures to stymie the frightening phenomenon.

Nigerians were still wrapping their heads around the disaster that occurred in Woji axis, Port Harcourt, penultimate Wednesday, when a similar calamity struck in Lagos the next day. The first tragedy occurred when a five-storey building collapsed, trapping several victims under the rubble. One person has been confirmed dead, while several others sustained varying degrees of injuries.

The second incident involved a three-storey building located in the Alakija area of Lagos state, triggering emergency responses by security operatives, men of Lagos State Emergency Management Agency (LASMA), the Lagos State Fire and Rescue Service (LSFRS), and residents in the areas during which efforts were made to pull out those trapped in the fallen structure. As at the last count, about seven people were confirmed dead, while 27 others sustained fatal injuries.

The latest tragedies underscore the notoriety of Nigeria as a leading country in Africa with the highest frequency and intensity of non-seismic building collapse. In fact, Lagos state alone accounts for over 50 per cent of the national calamities. In the same league with Nigeria are countries like India, which leads the pack globally, China, Brazil, and Egypt, among others, where buildings crumble on their own like a pack of cards.

Several factors have been identified as causes of this

phenomenon. Common among them are the use of substandard iron rods for concrete in addition to cutting corners in cement and sand mix ratio, absence of or weak regulatory oversight, and alteration of approved designs midway through construction by adding extra floors. This was exemplified by the tragic collapse of the guesthouse of the Synagogue Church of All Nations in Ikotun in 2014, where 115 people, including some foreigners, lost their lives in one fell swoop.

Others include the engagement of unqualified artisans instead of certified professionals and pervasive corruption dogging the sector. Then, there is the proliferation of quacks within the construction sector. Individuals without engineering qualifications are known to undertake complex structural projects, using fake professionals. Some project owners also supervise the jobs directly to save costs. There is no gainsaying the fact that developers are taking advantage of the high demand for residential and commercial accommodation. And, because of the prohibitive costs of building materials, they compromise standards.

The recent episodes in Port Harcourt should not be shrugged off as a fait accompli. The relevant government regulatory agencies must be up and running in the execution of their mandates to ensure public safety in the construction industry. They must carry out integrity tests on existing structures to identify those in distress. Any buildings so identified and beyond redemption should be marked for evacuation and subsequent demolition.

Furthermore, developers who cut corners leading to the collapse of their buildings should forfeit the

ownership of the plots to the government and be made to pay compensation to the victims and/or the families of such calamities if deaths result, in addition to other stiff penalties.

We are in sync with the recent call by the Real Estate Developers Association of Nigeria (REDAN), Lagos Chapter, for criminal prosecution of individuals whose negligence contributes to structural failures, insisting that demolition alone cannot solve the problem.

Other safety advocates are also of the view that unless those responsible face severe legal consequences, future developers may continue gambling with human lives.

The absence of visible punishment has created a perception that negligence carries little repercussions for exposing their fellow human beings to manmade calamities.

In the same vein, where it is established that the disaster occurs as a result of negligence or compromise by those charged with ensuring adherence to the building codes and regulations, those found culpable should be sanctioned appropriately too. So far, very few, if any, have been prosecuted for criminal negligence resulting in avoidable deaths.

We also urge tenants to notify the appropriate authorities about the conditions of their abodes. They should look out for distressed telltales such as unusual fissures, cracked beams, especially in older buildings. They should also raise an alarm over poor maintenance, illegal modifications, and prolonged exposure to environmental stress. Tenants are also advised to abandon any such buildings to save their lives.

OSHIOMHOLE: TRIBUTE TO A QUINTESSENTIAL PATRIOT

It was a call for a war against the Mafia who, in order to enhance their illegal ventures of stealing our common patrimony of gold, lithiums and several other precious minerals, have been recruiting and arming the rampaging vicious bands of terrorists in parts of the country where solid minerals are known to abound. It is of course, not unlikely that the people’s Senator was not conscious of the dangers to himself. He was just being himself: a patriotic leader propelled by share courage and altruism.

Like Shakespeare’s Julius Caesar, it is apt to say that, Senator Adams Oshiomhole is one of the people who by dint of divine grace and hard work, He Came; He Saw; He Conquered. In classical Latin: “Veni, Vidi, Vici”.

The Odyssey of Senator Oshiomhole is simply a thrilling tale of a man who has come a long way, traversing through several lands, climes and seasons. Unlike many with similar variegated exposures in their lives, Oshiomhole is not like the proverbial “rolling stone that gathers no moss”.

At every station and in all his contacts and engagements, he exudes an amazing tapestry of the kind of wisdom found only in somebody with a rich background of experience and knowledge. In spite of his disarming self-effacing mien, it is obvious to the discerning even in a fleeting encounter that, the man is highly cerebral, sharp witted.

The character traits and attributes that today define the personality of Senator Oshiomhole began to manifest when at a tender age, he left his native agrarian native home of Iyamho, Auchi in today’s Edo state to the comparatively bustling metropolitan cities of Kano and later, Kaduna to the far north of the country.

The young Adams was quick in assimilating and adapting to his new environment, that was so different from the world he was used to, in terms of cultural and language divergences.

As it happens to young persons of impressionable minds in cosmopolitan settings, his new circles of friends were people of different ethnic, social and cultural backgrounds. Most of the bonds of friendships he cultivated way back then, have endured through decades till date.

Providentially, his life was divinely guided to the textile industry in Kaduna still in his tender, formative years. There, as a young worker, he developed and nurtured his latent, inborn leadership qualities, his organisational acumen, his oratory, his selflessness, humane spirit and steadfast courage in the pursuits of goals he adjudged to be just courses.

It was natural for Oshiomhole to be attracted to trade union activities as he did. He quickly evolved into a zestful unionist with overt single-minded commitment to the struggle for workers welfare. The workers reciprocated by continually supporting him in his upward climb on the rungs of union’s leadership hierarchy.

From leadership positions at the local chapters of the union, he climbed steadily all the way to the pinnacle of becoming the General Secretary of the National Textiles and Garment Workers Union of Nigeria. The crowning point of his leadership role in labour union activism, was his election as President of the Nigeria Labour Congress (NLC) for a two-term

of eight years, 1999 to 2007.

The era was a watershed marked by phenomenal turning points in the annals of the nation’s labour movement. One outstanding challenge at the time, was that of steering the wheel of labour union through the historic transition of the country from military dictatorship to democratic civilian governance. To his eternal credit, Oshiomhole demonstrated the requisite leadership in the face of the emerging challenges.

Coinciding with a period when workers needed fundamental improvement in their conditions of service, the labour union required a courageous and focussed leadership especially, in the face of an equally strong and resolute President Olusegun Obasanjo.

Oshiomhole robustly showcased his gifted oratory, strategic thinking and organisational skills in a steadfast commitment to the course of the workers. Among other feats, he successfully negotiated wage increase for public sector workers, engaged in mass mobilisation against removal of petroleum subsidy and brought labour into reckoning as a critical force in a democracy.

At the end of the day, the name of Oshiomhole was etched amongst the f iconic legends in the cast of Michael Imodu and Hassan Sumonu in the golden chapters of the nation’s labour movement.

From the turfs of labour union, Oshiomhole ventured into partisan politics when he successfully contested the Edo state governorship race in 2008. Again, love him or hate him, there is no gainsaying the fact that he left Edo state much better than he met it.

During his two terms of eight years, 2008 to 2016, he initiated and aggressively pursued transformative programmes and projects that culminated in a plethora of legacy milestones in urban renewal, infrastructure, economic and social security facets of Edo state.

Even as he has been dutiful and diligent in his services as a Senator of the Federal Republic, it is noteworthy that Oshiomhole has as well engaged in a wide range of development activities in his constituency of Edo North. His impacts have been particularly profound in infrastructure development, education and skills training, healthcare access, youth and women empowerment, security and community safety programmes.

To us in Edo state, Oshiomhole stands out conspicuously in the galaxy of outstanding leaders that our state has been so uniquely lucky to have in its history. We are equally very happy and proud to have produced leader of the stature of Oshiomhole for the nation. In many climes, he will be celebrated as an iconic statesman, a special divine gift to the nation.

How non-existent Presidential Economic Advisory Council opened CBN account, misled Accountant-General's office — Presidency

The Presidency has accused Prince Adeniyi Adeyemi Matthew of using forged government documents to mislead the Office of the Accountant-General of the Federation into opening a Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) account for what it described as a fictitious government agency.

In a statement by presidential spokesman, Mr. Bayo Onanuga, the presidency accused Adeyemi of forging official documents from the Office of the Chief of Staff.

The statement reads: "We are aware of the public interest in the matter of a man called Adeyemi Adeniyi Matthew, who has been parading himself as the Director-General of a fictitious Presidential Foreign Intervention Promotion Council cum Presidential Economic Advisory Council.

"The Office of the Chief of Staff to the President first blew the whistle on the existence of the illegal agency, following complaints from officials of the Nigerian Investment Promotion Council that another government agency appeared to be functioning at cross-purposes with it.

"The Chief of Staff, on October 17, 2025, in a letter, asked the DSS and the Police to probe the activities of 'fraudsters and imposters' forging

Flood: Anambra, Benue, 2 others approve scheme for 100,000 riverine households

Four of Nigeria's most flood-prone states have approved a landmark pilot programme to protect riverine households, under a new partnership between the federal government, the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), and global risk financing firm (PULA) advisors.

Anambra, Benue, Kebbi, and Kogi states will lead the first phase of the Riverine Household Flood Protection Pilot, which will cover 100,000 households identified as most vulnerable in the 2026 Annual Flood Outlook.

The approval was announced Wednesday in Abuja at the close of a two-day Technical Workshop on the pilot exercise, jointly convened by NEMA and PULA Advisors.

Speaking at the event, PULA advisors' Country Director, Dr. Mike Enahoro, said the pilot would be data-driven, with a clear path for expansion after evaluation.

"In arriving at the selected states for this pilot phase, data from Federal Government Agencies was used, and the watchword was vulnerability. The pilot phase will see 100,000 household covered in this scheme, mind you, we will rely on accurate data for the most vulnerable households to be captured. There is possibility of scaling up after a holistic assessment of the pilot phase," he stated.

Appreciating NEMA's leadership, Dr. Enahoro noted that "NEMA leadership has been talking with PULA Advisors in finding a lasting solution and reducing the impact on people vulnerable to floodings."

Key features include a dedicated dialysis centre to address chronic kidney disease locally, a standard operating theatre, a labour and maternity room, piped oxygen supply in every ward, and a renewable energy power system to ensure uninterrupted care.

Mrs. Tinubu also noted that the clinic is designed to bring life-saving services closer to residents who previously had to travel long distances for treatment.

FCT Police secure conviction for murder of 80-year-old man, wife

The Federal Capital Territory (FCT) Police Command has secured the conviction of one Jonathan Marcus, who was arrested and prosecuted in connection with the murder of an 80-year-old man, Mr. Adebola Ezekiel, and his wife, Abiodun, in 2024.

Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO) for the command, SP Josephine Adeh, made this known in a press statement, Wednesday in Abuja.

The statement read: "The FCT Police Command wishes to inform members of the public that it has secured the conviction of Jonathan Marcus, who was arrested and prosecuted in connection with the gruesome murder of Mr. Adebola Ezekiel (80) and his wife, Mrs. Abiodun Ezekiel, at their residence in Apo Legislative Quarters, Abuja.

"The tragic incident, which occurred on April 1, 2024, at the

deceased persons' residence in Zone D, Apo Legislative Quarters, was subjected to an extensive investigation.

"The investigation led to the arrest of the suspect, Jonathan Marcus, a former driver to the deceased, who was tracked to Obajana, Kogi state,

where he had gone into hiding after he committed the crime. He was subsequently arrested and brought to Abuja for further investigation.

"The suspect was arraigned before the FCT High Court, where the Command diligently prosecuted the case. After evaluating the evidence

adduced by the prosecution and hearing the submissions of counsel, Hon. Justice M. S. Idris of the FCT High Court held that the prosecution had proved its case beyond reasonable doubt. Consequently, the Court convicted Jonathan Marcus and sentenced him to death by hanging for the murder of Mr. Adebola Ezekiel and Mrs. Abiodun Ezekiel."

Anambra to end development levies, 10% commission from tenants

The Anambra state government Wednesday said it was working towards regulating the housing estate to abolish illegal collections of development levies and 10 percent commission from land buyers and tenants respectively.

The Commissioner for Information and Value Reformation, Dr Law

Mefor, who stated this in Awka during a courtesy call by Real Estate Developers Association of Nigeria (REDAN), Anambra state chapter, described the practices as criminality, exploitation, and environmental abuse in the housing sector.

He said the government was contemplating legislation to regulate this in order to moderate abnormal rent hikes because it was worrisome how agents demand ten percent

from both landlords and tenants even though they did not build the house.

"A landlord moving rent from N1 million to N3 million is abnormal and therefore unjust. There has to be a gradual adjustment to protect both landlords and tenants. The government will no longer tolerate development levies imposed by youth cliques in places like Okpoko, Obosi, and Oba, among others," he added.

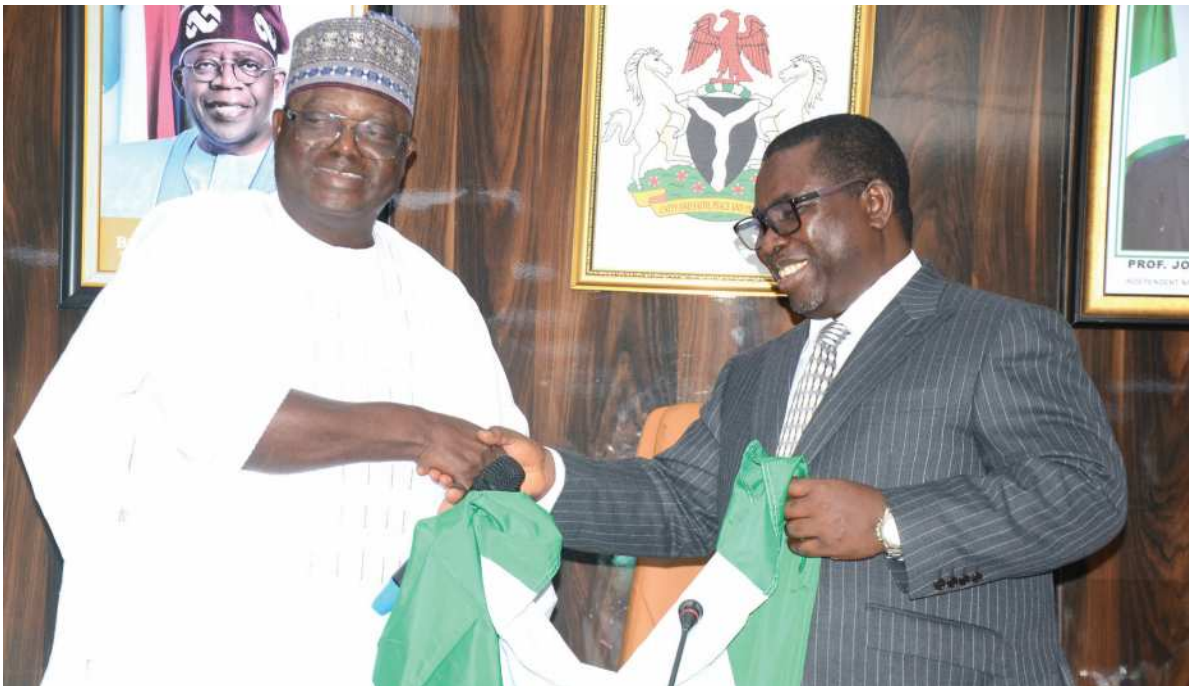

The Defence Headquarters (DHQ) Wednesday said troops of the Armed Forces of Nigeria (AFN) deployed to different theatres of operations across the country, recorded significant operational successes during the second quarter of 2026, neutralising 662 terrorists and other criminal elements.

The military high command also said troops arrested 1,084 suspects, and rescued 951 kidnapped victims during the period under review.

Director Defence Media Operations, Major General Michael Onoja, disclosed this while addressing journalists in Abuja.

He said troops also destroyed 12 illegal refining sites and recovered over 464,268 litres of petroleum products including crude oil, Automotive Gas Oil, Dual Purpose Kerosene, and Premium Motor Spirit during the period under review.

According to him, the operational achievements recorded during June and the second quarter underscored the professionalism, operational excellence and unwavering resolve of troops deployed across all theaters.

Onoja further disclosed that in June 2026 alone, troops neutralised 129 terrorists and criminals, arrested 486 suspects, rescued 542 kidnapped civilians, and facilitated the surrender of 11 insurgents.

Senate primaries: Goje, Ned Nwoko, Echocho, 18 others fail APC review, 4 scale hurdle

With just about six months to the Presidential and National Assembly elections slated for January 16, 2027 by the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), the All Progressives Congress (APC) has given succour to four out of 25 serving senators who lost out in its primaries penultimate month .

Among the 21 lawmakers, who didn't scale through the APC review of the exercise are Danjuma Goje (Gombe Central), Ned Nwoko (Delta North) and Jibril Isah Echocho, representing Kogi East in the Red Chamber.

At the end of the primaries conducted by the APC May this year for its senatorial candidates across the 109 senatorial districts in the country, 25 out of 80 serving senators in its fold then lost out, while 55 made it either on return ticket to the Senate or governorship ticket of their respective states.

While the trio of Senators Solomon Olamilekan Adeola (Ogun West), Aliyu Wadada Ahmed (Nasarawa West) and Sharafadeen Abiodun Alli (Oyo South), all succeeded in clinching governorship tickets of APC for their various states, 52 others secured return tickets of the party for the January 2027 National Assembly Election.

However, after five weeks of thorough review of outcome of the primaries across the 109 Senatorial Districts, the loss suffered by four out of the 25 affected lawmakers were quashed.

Specifically, Senators Titus Sam (Benue North West), Emmanuel Udende (Benue North East), Adeniyi Adegbonmire (Ondo Central) and Olajide Ipinsagba (Ondo North), have been included in the final list of the party's senatorial candidates.

Consequently, the fate of the remaining 21 serving senators who lost out completely in the primaries, seemed to have been sealed by the party's decision.

Troops neutralised 662 terrorists, arrested 1,084 suspects in 3 months – DHQ

He attributed the successes to “sustained joint land operations, close air support, intelligence-driven missions and coordinated operations that significantly degraded the capabilities of terrorist groups including Boko Haram, ISWAP, the proscribed Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB) and its armed wing, the Eastern Security Network (ESN), as well as kidnapping syndicates, oil theft cartels and cross-border arms traffickers.

North East Providing theatre-by theatre updates, the Defence spokesman said troops of Joint Task Force Northeast Operation HADIN KAI sustained pressure on Boko Haram and ISWAP across Adamawa, Borno and Yobe states.”

In June, he said troops neutralised 76 terrorists, arrested 97 suspects, rescued 465 kidnapped victims, and facilitated the surrender of 11 insurgents and their families.

According to him, one of the most significant operations was conducted on 6 June, when troops carried out a multi axis assault in the Mandara Mountains, Borno state, rescuing 360 civilians, mostly women and children, who had remained in terrorist captivity

since their abduction from Ngoshe on 3 March.

“Other notable achievements included the rescue of 53 civilians and eight hijacked vehicles along the Buratai-Kamuya Road, repelling coordinated terrorist attacks in Buratai and Lamurde, dismantling terrorist logistics networks, arresting key collaborators and rescuing seven abducted schoolchildren and a teacher following an attack on Government Secondary School, Lassa, in Askira Uba Local Government Area.

“For the quarter, Operation HADIN KAI neutralised 484 terrorists, arrested 370 suspects, rescued 595 kidnapped victims, and received the surrender of 38 insurgents and their families,” he said.

...Northwest

In the Northwest, he said troops of Operation FANSAN YAMMA recorded major successes across Kaduna, Katsina, Kebbi and Zamfara states.

He disclosed that troops neutralised 33 terrorists, arrested 165 suspects, and rescued 51 kidnapped victims in the month of June alone.

The operations resulted in the

recovery of numerous firearms, motorcycles, improvised explosive device (IED) materials and large quantities of ammunition.

“Notable achievements included the arrest of a notorious terrorist kingpin at Shinkafi market, interception of over 1,000 rounds of ammunition, arrests of terrorist collaborators arriving on a pilgrim flight, and the apprehension of logistics suppliers transporting 69 jerry cans of fuel intended for terrorist groups,” he said.

General Onoja said the cumulative operational successes demonstrated the Armed Forces’ enduring commitment to restoring peace, stability and public confidence across the country.

He added that the Defence Headquarters would continue to consolidate operational gains through sustained offensive operations, enhanced intelligence gathering and improved inter-agency collaboration.

...15 killed in Benue attack

In a related development, about 15 people were reportedly killed Wednesday in an early morning attack on Saai community in Mbajir Ward of Katsina-Ala local government area of

Benue state.

The assault also left several residents injured, with many rushed to hospital for treatment.

Report gathered indicated that the attackers were terrorists masquerading as herdsmen.

Responding to the incident in a statement issued by his Chief Press Secretary, Sir Tersoo Kula, Governor Hyacinth Alia condemned the attack, describing it as a senseless assault on innocent citizens.

He said the incident was particularly disturbing as farmers had returned to their ancestral lands to cultivate their crops.

The governor ordered the immediate deployment of additional security personnel to Saai and surrounding communities, as well as a manhunt to apprehend those responsible.

He also directed security agencies to guarantee the safety of farmers and prevent further attacks on agricultural communities.

Governor Alia extended his condolences to the bereaved families, wished the injured a speedy recovery, and urged residents to remain calm, vigilant and report suspicious activities to security agencies.

...Aondoakaa seeks urgent action

Also in another reaction, the People's Democratic Party (PDP) governorship candidate for the 2027 election in Benue state, Chief Michael Kaase Aondoakaa, SAN, condemned the recent wave of attacks across the state, describing the killings as unacceptable and called for urgent action to end the violence.

In a statement by his media assistant, James Ian, the silk expressed shock over the attack on Saai community and extended his condolences to the bereaved families while wishing the injured speedy recovery.

He also condemned the killing of the Benue State Chairman of the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association of Nigeria (MACBAN), Alhaji Ardo Risku Muhammad, and urged security agencies to ensure those responsible face the weight of the law.

The former AGF called on the Benue state government to fulfil its constitutional responsibility of protecting lives and property through proactive measures against terrorists, bandits and other criminal elements.

Aondoakaa questioned the utilisation of the state's security votes, insisting that the funds should translate into improved logistics, intelligence gathering and stronger support for security agencies to prevent further attacks.

He also expressed concern over the poor state of rural roads, saying they hinder security operations, and urged the military, police and other security agencies to intensify efforts to restore peace and bring the perpetrators of the attacks to justice.

CBN revokes licences of 46 microfinance banks

The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) has revoked the operating licences of 46 microfinance banks, effective 1 July, citing failure to meet regulatory requirements for operation.

The apex bank announced the decision in a statement issued on Wednesday, saying the revocation was carried out in accordance with its powers under Sections 12 and 13 of the Banks and Other Financial Institutions Act (BOFIA), 2020.

According to CBN, the revocation was approved by its governor, Olayemi Cardoso, following the affected banks’ failure to satisfy the conditions required to continue operating as licensed financial

institutions.

The CBN said the decision was necessary due to one or more regulatory breaches by the affected institutions.

According to the revocation order, the reasons include insufficient assets to meet liabilities, closure of operations without the CBN's approval, and inactivity and cessation of financial intermediation.

The other reasons for the revocation of the microfinance banks’ licences include failure to commence operations within 12 months of licence approval and failure to maintain the minimum capital funds unimpaired by losses.

The apex bank said the action forms part of its ongoing efforts to strengthen oversight of the financial system and ensure that licensed financial institutions comply with extant laws and prudential regulations.

“The revocation of the licenses is part of the Bank's ongoing efforts to safeguard the stability of the financial sector, protect depositors, and ensure that licensed institutions comply with current laws and regulatory requirements,” CBN said.

It added that it remains committed to promoting a safe, sound, and resilient financial system through effective supervision and, where

necessary, enforcement.

“The Central Bank of Nigeria remains committed to promoting a safe, sound, and resilient financial system and will continue to take appropriate supervisory and regulatory actions, where necessary, to maintain public confidence in the Nigerian financial system,” the apex bank added.

The licence revocations are the latest in the CBN's efforts to intensify the supervision of banks and other financial institutions, with a focus on corporate governance, risk management, regulatory compliance, and financial stability. (Premium Times)

Gunmen kidnap Benue pastor, church members

A pastor, Samuel Gbinde, and two members of his congregation have been kidnapped in Benue state, amid growing concerns over insecurity in the state.

Pastor Gbinde is a minister of the Universal Reform Christian Church (URCC), also known as Nongu u Kristu u i Ser u sha Tar (NKST).

The general secretary of URCC, Titus Targba, said in a statement Wednesday that the incident occurred Tuesday.

“The victims were abducted from the pastor’s residence at NKST Church, Andyar, in Ishan Classis, Benue state,” he said.

Mr Targba called on church members and the public to pray for the safe and unconditional release of the abducted pastor and the two church members.

He also urged security agencies and both the Benue state and federal governments to act swiftly to rescue the victims and arrest those responsible.

“We further call on the relevant security agencies, as well as the governments of Benue state and the Federal Republic of Nigeria, to act swiftly and decisively to secure the safe rescue of the abducted persons and ensure that those responsible for this criminal act are apprehended and brought to justice,” he said.

The church further urged the authorities to adopt more proactive measures against kidnapping and other violent crimes.

“It is imperative to take the fight to the perpetrators rather than merely responding after these heinous crimes have been committed,”

Targba said.

The latest abduction comes amid heightened security concerns in Benue state.

The killing of the Benue state

chairman of the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association of Nigeria (MACBAN), Ardo Risku, and his associate, Yakubu Isa, was reported on 26 June after they attended a

peace meeting in Ohimini local government area. Police later announced the arrest of 10 suspects in connection with the killings.

The NKST abduction adds to a

series of kidnappings and violent attacks that have continued to affect communities across Benue despite ongoing security operations and peace initiatives. (Premium Times)

Kano SAPZ distributes farm inputs to 2,710 wet season farmers

The Kano State Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zones (SAPZ) Programme has distributed agricultural inputs to 2,710 smallholder farmers under the 2025 Wet Season Matching Grant Implementation Scheme, aimed at promoting climate-smart agriculture, enhancing food security and increasing agricultural productivity across the state.

The intervention, implemented under the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD)-supported Component Two of the SAPZ Programme, provides farmers

with improved seeds, fertilizers, and other essential farm inputs to strengthen resilience against climate change and improve rural livelihoods.

In a statement issued by the Kano State Knowledge Management and Communication Officer, Hajiya Rabi Mustapha Sadiq, Wednesday, the initiative demonstrates the programme’s commitment to supporting farmers in overcoming challenges such as climate change, rising production costs and limited access to quality agricultural inputs.

Agro-Productivity Enhancement Officer, Dr. Rabi’u Sani Shawai, stated that the beneficiaries were drawn from eight participating local

government areas.

A total of 1,410 rice farmers benefited from Garun Malam (320), Bagwai (550), Bichi (440), and Gezawa (100), while 1,300 groundnut farmers received inputs in Bebeji (400), Dawakin Tofa (352), Dambatta (298) and Gezawa (300).

The programme urged beneficiaries to adopt Good Agronomic Practices (GAP), including the use of improved seeds, proper spacing, balanced fertilizer application, integrated pest management and efficient water-use techniques to maximize yields and ensure sustainable production.

The statement also acknowledged the support of the federal government,

Kano state government, IFAD, implementing partners, community leaders and farmer organisations for the successful implementation of the intervention.

The wet season distribution builds on the programme’s earlier 2025 dry season intervention, during which 10,889 farmers received agricultural inputs, including 9,834 rice farmers, 500 tomato farmers, and 555 groundnut farmers.

With the additional 2,710 wet season beneficiaries, the SAPZ Programme has now supported a total of 13,599 farmers in 2025, comprising 11,244 rice farmers, 1,855 groundnut farmers, and 500 tomato farmers across Kano state.

Why court records must be safeguarded against alteration – CJN

The Chief Justice of Nigeria (CJN), Hon Justice Kudirat Kekere-Ekun, Wednesday, restated the urgent need to safeguard court records against any form of unauthorised alteration, manipulation, loss or misuse. She said doing so will strengthen the security, integrity and traceability of court records.

She stated that by creating a secured digital repository and comprehensive audit trail for all processes and records filed before the court, the system will substantially reduce record tampering and reinforce public confidence.

She described the transition from a paper-based system to a technology-enabled justice system as capable of helping in modernising judicial administration across the federation.

The CJN noted that the administration of justice depends fundamentally upon the honesty, ethical conduct and professionalism of all stakeholders, including judicial officers, court personnel and members of the legal profession.

She added: “Technological innovation cannot succeed in the absence of professional integrity.”

Kekere-Ekun stated in Abuja at the formal commencement of the

Supreme Court mandatory upload of electronic copies of processes, record of appeal, and other matters practice direction 202, and the implementation of the Nigerian case management system (NCMS).

While justifying the new standards of judicial administration, the CJN reminded the audience that across the world, courts are increasingly embracing technology as a critical tool in improving case management,

enhancing access to justice, preserving institutional records and ensuring timely resolution of disputes.

“The Nigerian judiciary cannot afford to remain on the sidelines of this global transformation. This initiative represents a major step towards the realisation of a fully digitised registry and a more efficient, technology driven judicial system.

“By reducing dependence on manual processes and paper based

record management, the system will significantly improve case tracking, record retrieval, document management and the overall workflow within the registry,” she stated.

In a goodwill message, the president of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), Mazi Afam Osigwe, SAN, commended the initiative, saying that the court filing and case management system is key, warning that “the court should either innovate or die.”

Lawyer to Nigerian youth: Don’t blame leaders alone for our woes

A lawyer, author and convener of Open Mic with Shine, Shine Nwosu, has urged Nigerian youth to stop blaming political leaders alone for the country’s challenges, saying national transformation begins with personal responsibility and moral values.

Nwosu stated this on the sidelines of the maiden edition of Open Mic with Shine held at the University of Abuja, where students participated in spoken word poetry and literary presentations on the theme, Nigeria and Morality.

He said while many Nigerians are seeking opportunities to leave the country, others must remain committed to rebuilding it by changing the culture of blame and embracing accountability.

“The wrong message is out there. People keep waiting for someone else to fix Nigeria. Every right-thinking person should instead ask, ‘What can I do?’ That is the mindset we are trying to promote,” he said.

The legal practitioner argued that the country’s leadership crisis is a reflection of the moral state of society, insisting that leaders emerge from the same environment as the people they

govern.

“Society creates leaders. The people ruling us did not fall from the sky. If society is corrupt, those who eventually occupy leadership positions will most likely reflect that corruption,” he said.

He added that institutions such as schools, religious organisations and the judiciary must uphold integrity if the country hopes to produce credible leaders.

“If lecturers refuse to collect bribes, if religious leaders uphold moral values and if there is integrity across our institutions, it becomes difficult for dishonest people to emerge as leaders,” Nwosu said.

DSS docks 5 Sylva’s associates over alleged information concealment

The Department of the State Service DSS Wednesday arraigned five associates of former Minister of Petroleum, Chief Timipre Sylva, at the Federal High Court, Abuja on alleged information concealment on the where about of their principal allegedly implicated as the financier of aborted coup attempt against President Bola Tinubu.

Sylva, a former governor of Bayelsa state, has been declared wanted by the federal government and his identified properties marked for forfeiture following indictment of being the sponsor and mastermind of the alleged coup plot.

The five associates are Reuben Ayuba, Musa Mohammed, Friday Paul, Paganengigha Anagaha, and Ayebaifife Suobite, who were arraigned Wednesday before Justice Peter Lifu.

A 2-count charge slammed against them indicated that the accused persons on April 28, 2026 became accessories after the fact of felony by concealing the whereabouts of Timiprey Silva, said to be a fugitive of the law.

The alleged offence is said to be contrary to Section 519 of the Criminal Code Act Law of the Federation of Nigeria, 2004.

DSS also accused them of conspiracy to commit a felony to wit: concealing the whereabouts of Timiprey Silva, who is a fugitive of the law contrary to Section 516 of the Criminal Code LFN, 2004.

However, all the accused persons pleaded not guilty to the charges when read to them. DSS lawyer Emmanuel Orubor asked the judge to give a date for the DSS to open their trial by calling witnesses to testify against them.

“Men in Black” premieres in theaters

On July 2, 1997, the science fiction-comedy movie Men in Black, starring Will Smith and Tommy Lee Jones, opens in theaters around the United States. The film grossed more than \$250 million in America alone and helped establish the former sitcom star Will Smith as one of Hollywood’s most bankable leading men.

Directed by Barry Sonnenfeld (Get Shorty), Men in Black was based on an early 1990s comic book by Lowell Cunningham called The Men in Black. Smith and Jones reprised their roles as Agent J and Agent K, two secret agents who must protect the Earth from aliens, in the sequels Men in Black II (2002) and Men in Black III (2012). (Neither appeared in the 2019 spin-off Men in Black: International.)

Born September 25, 1968, in West Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Smith formed the rap group D.J. Jazzy Jeff and The Fresh Prince with his friend Jeffrey Townes when they were teenagers. Radio-friendly hits like “Parents Just Don’t Understand” and “Summertime” propelled the duo to success, and in 1988, they won the first-ever Grammy Award for rap music. Smith would go on to a successful solo career, scoring No. 1 hits with the theme song from Men in Black as well as the smash hit single “Getting’ Jiggy Wit It.” From 1990 to 1996, Smith starred in the popular TV sitcom The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air. His early film roles included Six Degrees of Separation (1993) and Bad Boys (1995) with Martin Lawrence. Smith’s first blockbuster movie was 1996’s Independence Day, about a hostile alien invasion. After Men in Black, Smith starred in a string of movies, including Enemy of the State (1998), Wild Wild West (1999), Bad Boys II (2003), I, Robot (2004), Hitch (2005), I Am Legend (2007) Hancock (2008), Suicide Squad (2016) and Aladdin

(2019). Though met with varying degrees of success, these films showcased Smith’s talents as an action star with great comedic timing.

In addition, Smith has made several successful forays into serious drama, receiving an Academy Award nomination for Best Actor for 2001’s Ali, about boxer Muhammad Ali. The actor nabbed a second Oscar nomination for his star turn in 2007’s The Pursuit of Happyness, which was based on the true story of the homeless salesman-turned-stockbroker Chris Gardner. The film co-starred Smith’s son Jaden. Smith and his wife, the actress Jada Pinkett Smith, married in 1997 and have two children, Jaden and Willow (Smith has another son, Trey, from a previous marriage). Pinkett Smith’s film credits include The Nutty Professor (1996), The Matrix Reloaded (2003), Collateral (2004), The Women (2008) and Girls Trip (2017).

Smith severely damaged his career and reputation when he shocked the world by charging onstage at the 2022 Academy Awards presentation and slapping the show’s host Chris Rock for making a joke about his wife. Later that evening, Smith won the Best Actor Oscar for his starring role in King Richard.

Stem transnational banditry in West Africa

Transnational banditry in West Africa refers to highly organised, economically motivated criminal networks operating across Nigeria's borders with Niger, Chad, Mali, Cameroon, and Benin. These heavily armed groups primarily terrorise Nigeria's North-west and North-central zones through kidnapping for ransom, arms smuggling, cattle rustling, and systematic extortion of rural communities. Millions of people have been displaced as a result of armed attacks by bandits in West Africa. Internally displaced people camps have been created across Nigeria.

Armed groups, bandits, and terrorists from Mali, the Niger Republic, Chad, Sudan, and Cameroon frequently operate in Nigeria. The crisis is heavily driven by deeply porous borders and the transnational movement of militant networks. Terrorist factions and bandits from the Sahel, most notably, elements linked to Jama'at Nusrat al-Islam wa al-Muslimin (JNIM) and the relatively new Lakurawa group, have infiltrated Northern Nigeria.

These groups utilise ungoverned spaces and have been known to cross international boundaries, merging with local bandits and kidnapping syndicates. The tri-border areas of Nigeria are heavily affected by cross-border militants. Factions such as Boko Haram and the Islamic State's West Africa Province (ISWAP) operate across Nigeria, Chad, Cameroon, and Niger, making the entire basin a hotspot for violence.

Many large-scale bandit cells operating in Nigeria's North-west are composed of individuals from neighbouring West African and Central African nations. For example, notorious militia leaders have commanded networks stretching as far as Mali, Senegal, Cameroon, and the Central African Republic. The Economic Community of West Africa States (ECOWAS) must rise to eliminate transnational banditry in subregion.

External recruitment of bandits and foreign armed groups into Nigeria is highly active, primarily fueled by the country's porous 1,287-kilometer northern border, the broader security vacuum in the Sahel region, and lucrative transnational criminal networks. Recently, about five nationals from Niger Republic, Chad and Sudan were arrested in Lagos. Few days ago, the court in Sokoto sentenced a Nigerien to death for banditry and killing of innocent Nigerians.

While traditional domestic banditry in Nigeria's North-west and North-central zones initially emerged from localised farmer-herder conflicts, it has dramatically evolved into a transnational crisis. Foreign terrorist networks are increasingly embedding themselves in, or recruiting directly from, Nigerian criminals.

Foreign bandits have increasingly infiltrated

Nigeria, taking advantage of the country's highly porous international borders to exacerbate the country's ongoing security crisis. While the roots of armed banditry are primarily local, security experts, local officials, and communities state that a significant transnational wave of armed mercenaries and criminal networks from neighbouring Sahelian countries (such as Mali, Chad, Sudan and Niger) has actively entered the country. The dynamics of foreign banditry in Nigeria involve several critical layers.

The epicenter: The North-west zone, particularly Zamfara, Katsina, Kaduna, Sokoto, and Kebbi states, remains the hardest hit by these non-state armed groups.

The spread: While historically concentrated in rural areas, these networks have expanded into highways (e.g., the Abuja-Kaduna and Lagos-Ibadan expressways) and urban centers to abduct prominent figures and travelers.

Transborder movements: Weak border management and porous frontiers in the Sahel allow these groups to evade security forces, cross into neighbouring West African countries to hide, and smuggle small arms and light

weapons into Nigeria.

Banditry is described as a multifaceted crime encompassing acts such as armed robbery, murder, rape, kidnapping, cattle rustling, armed attacks, and raids targeting local communities. Perpetrated by groups defined as 'highly fragmented' and diverse in terms of their capabilities and degree of organisation, violence arising from banditry has increasingly become both more widespread and lethal, spreading from the North-west to other zones and affecting remote villages, towns, and cities.

In 2024, Nigeria Watch reported an increase in fatalities arising from rural banditry, cattle rustling and related government operations (1,452 deaths, compared to 892 in 2023), with most fatalities recorded in Katsina, Zamfara and Kaduna. In mid-2025, a further 'significant surge' in violence linked to banditry was reported, particularly across Niger, Katsina and Zamfara.

Early 2024 saw a rise in kidnappings for ransom across the country including hundreds of abductions in various parts of Northern Nigeria in February and March 2024. According to

a February 2024 study by the Nigeria-based polling agency NOIPolls, the prevalence of kidnapping was highest in the North-central zone, followed by the South-west, North-west, and South-east.

According to the consulting firm Nextier, 2,452 individuals were kidnapped during the year 2024, a 31% rise over the 1,878 victims of kidnapping recorded in 2023. At the same time, abduction-related fatalities dropped in 2024, according to Nigeria Watch (425 deaths, compared to 536 recorded in 2023).

2025 saw continued large-scale kidnappings and killings of abductees with kidnappings remaining a 'pervasive threat' across multiple states as of mid-2025 urban and rural areas, along with national highways, have emerged as vulnerable locations where kidnappings occur. Victims of kidnappings included villagers, travellers, political figures, large numbers of schoolchildren, and IDPs businesspeople.

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The International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking

Every year on June 26, the world observes the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, also known as World Drug Day. The day was established by the United Nations to raise awareness about the dangers of drug abuse and the harmful effects of illegal drug trafficking on individuals, families, and communities. It is more than just a date on the calendar; it is a reminder that the fight against drugs requires the efforts of governments, schools, families, communities, and young people themselves.

Drug abuse remains one of the most serious public health and social challenges in the world today. According to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), nearly 300 million people worldwide use drugs, and millions struggle with drug-related disorders that affect their health, education, employment, and relationships. These figures show that drug abuse is not a distant problem affecting only a few people. It is a global issue that touches almost every society in one way or another.

Behind every drug statistics is a real human story. It could be a student who drops out of school because of addiction, a family that loses a loved one to an overdose, or a young person whose dreams are destroyed by substance abuse. Many people begin experimenting with drugs out of curiosity, peer pressure, stress,

or a desire to escape personal challenges. Unfortunately, what starts as a temporary experience can quickly become a lifelong struggle.

Drug abuse does not only affect the person using drugs. Families often experience emotional pain, financial difficulties, and broken relationships. Communities may witness increased crime, violence, and insecurity linked to drug trafficking and addiction. When young people become trapped in substance abuse, society loses valuable talent, creativity, and future leaders. This is why preventing drug abuse benefits everyone, not just those directly affected.

The illegal drug trade is another major concern. Drug trafficking networks operate across borders, generating huge profits while fueling crime, corruption, and violence. Criminal groups often target vulnerable communities and young people, making the fight against drug trafficking a matter of public safety as well as public health. Efforts to stop these networks require cooperation among countries, law enforcement agencies, and communities.

One of the most important messages of World Drug Day is that prevention is better than cure. Young people who receive accurate information about drugs are more likely to make healthy decisions. Schools,

parents, religious institutions, and community organisations all have a role to play in educating young people about the risks of substance abuse. Open conversations can help prevent curiosity from turning into addiction.

The media also has an important responsibility. Journalists, broadcasters, content creators, and social media influencers can help spread facts about drug abuse and challenge misinformation. Positive stories about recovery, rehabilitation, and healthy lifestyles can inspire people who may be struggling. Media campaigns can also encourage communities to support prevention efforts rather than remain silent about the problem.

Communities can contribute in practical ways. Parents should pay attention to changes in their children's behaviour and maintain open communication. Schools should organise awareness programmes and counseling services. Community leaders can support youth activities such as sports, skills training, and mentorship programmes that give young people positive alternatives. Employers can also create supportive environments that encourage mental well-being and access to help when needed.

Another important step is showing compassion to people recovering from addiction. Many individuals who struggle with substance abuse need support, treatment, and encouragement rather than stigma and rejection. Recovery is often a difficult journey, but many people successfully rebuild their lives when they receive the right assistance from families, professionals, and communities. Supporting recovery helps create safer and healthier societies for everyone.

As the world marks the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, each of us has a role to play. Whether by educating others, supporting prevention programmes, encouraging healthy lifestyles, or helping those in recovery, our actions can make a difference. A drug-free society cannot be achieved by governments alone. It requires collective responsibility, awareness, and commitment. By working together, we can protect lives, strengthen communities, and build a future where young people are free to pursue their dreams without the burden of drug abuse.

Challenges: Why APC-govt deserves patience, not blame

When civil servants finally voted them out in 2015, it was because the PDP government could no longer even pay workers' salaries. They institutionalised political thuggery, placing thugs and cronies on the government payroll. This created the massive 'ghost worker' syndrome that crippled many states.

The APC government has had to spend immense resources and years correcting these foundational issues. For instance, the Kogi state government spent years screening its workforce to eliminate ghost workers. Resolving that single crisis is what finally allowed the state to

reallocate funds toward massive infrastructural development.

The PDP also left abandoned projects scattered across Nigeria. A prime example is the Abuja-Lokoja road expansion. Awarded in 2006, billions were budgeted annually, yet nothing tangible was done until the APC took over in 2015.

The APC administrations of former President Muhammadu Buhari and current President Bola Ahmed Tinubu have consistently made efforts to recover our stolen national assets and reverse these ugly trends. The root of Nigeria's current struggles lies squarely within the faulty foundation laid by the PDP at the start of the Fourth Republic.

Instead of criticism, Nigerians should appreciate the current administration for the difficult, wonderful job they are doing to rebuild the nation.

Enugu: Police foil attempted robbery, neutralise one, arrest 4 others

The Enugu state Police command has recorded significant operational successes in its sustained border security efforts under the Inspector-General of Police's "Handshake Patrol" initiative.

The operations, conducted at different border locations across the state, led to the foiling of an attempted armed robbery, the neutralisation of one armed robbery suspect, the arrest of four other suspects, and the recovery of two firearms, suspected illicit drugs, and other incriminating exhibits.

The police spokesman, Daniel Ndukwe who stated this in a release Wednesday, stated that in one of the operations on June 28, 2026, at about 6:15 a.m., operatives attached to the command's Amechi-Idodo Division, in collaboration with members of the Neighbourhood Watch, foiled an armed robbery attempt and dislodged the criminal gang that had blocked a section of the Enugu-Abakaliki Road to rob commuters.

"The gang, which had been on the command's watch list for armed robberies along the border road, engaged the operatives in a gun duel during which its leader, Ifesinachi Kenneth (male), sustained gunshot injuries and was arrested while other members escaped.

"Ifesinachi's confessional statement led to the arrest of Izuchukwu Nwanga (male), who kept the gang's proceeds of crime. Kenneth was taken for medical treatment but was later confirmed dead," Ndukwe disclosed.

He said: "In another border operation carried out at about 5:30 p.m. on the same date, police operatives attached to the Umumba Division, acting on credible intelligence linked to an armed robbery gang, stormed a criminal hideout at Umumba Ndiagu Community in Ezeagu local government area, bordering Anambra state.

"The operatives arrested two suspects identified as Uwah Ifesinachi Sunday (male, 23) and Chinonso Okafor Paul (male, 25). One locally fabricated pistol, a knife, a scissors, and quantities of substances suspected to be Indian hemp were recovered."

Ndukwe pointed out that in a similar operation, at about 10:00 a.m. on the same date, operatives of the Command's Distress Response Squad (DRS), while conducting stop-and-search operations along the Enugu-Onitsha Expressway at Ugwuoba in Oji-River local government area, bordering Anambra state, intercepted a commercial tricycle conveying passengers.

Zamfara: Gov Lawal bans farming in cemeteries

The Zamfara state governor, Dauda Lawal, Wednesday, banned all forms of farming in cemeteries across the state with immediate effect.

He gave the directive during an inspection visit to one of the cemeteries in Gusau.

He said the practice of cultivating

crops on burial grounds was no longer acceptable.

Governor Lawal also ordered that all existing crops already planted in cemeteries be destroyed without delay.

"Any person found farming inside a cemetery will have their crops destroyed immediately," the governor warned.

He stated that the directive takes

effect from the moment it was issued and must be complied with across all 14 local government areas of the state.

The governor stated that cemeteries are sacred public spaces meant to preserve the dignity and memory of the dead and using them for agricultural purposes desecrates the sites and violates cultural and religious values.

He urged traditional rulers,

community leaders and relevant government agencies to ensure strict compliance and to sensitise residents on the new policy.

The governor's office said monitoring teams will be deployed to ensure the order is enforced across the state.

NDLEA takes custody of 6,778.5kg Canadian Loud seized at Lagos port

The National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) has formally taken custody of 6,778.5 kilograms of Canadian Loud, a high-grade strain of cannabis, intercepted at the Apapa Port in Lagos in what authorities described as one of Nigeria's biggest anti-narcotics operations.

The seizure followed intelligence-led joint operations involving the NDLEA, the Nigeria Customs Service, other security agencies, and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police

(RCMP).

Representing NDLEA chairman and chief executive, Brig. Gen. Mohamed Buba Marwa (Rtd), at the handover ceremony Wednesday, the Agency's Director of Seaport Operations (ACGN), Ibinabo Archie-Abia, said the operation underscored the effectiveness of inter-agency collaboration in tackling transnational organised crime.

Marwa said the two major seizures recorded on June 15 and June 24 sent a strong warning to international drug traffickers that Nigeria's security agencies remain

determined to dismantle criminal networks operating across borders.

He added that the consignments were tracked over several months through multiple international shipping routes before being intercepted at Apapa Port, despite efforts by traffickers to conceal their movements through different ports and trans-shipment points.

The NDLEA boss added that the agency's mission goes beyond seizing illicit drugs, stating that it would intensify efforts to identify, arrest and prosecute members of the syndicates while confiscating assets acquired through drug trafficking.

NBC DG urges stronger synergy to tackle boundary disputes

"This engagement has provided an important platform for direct engagement between the National Assembly and key stakeholders who are at the forefront of addressing boundary and border issues across the country," Surveyor Adaji said.

He reaffirmed the commission's commitment to resolving boundary disputes through dialogue, technical expertise and sustained collaboration with relevant stakeholders, with the ultimate goal of promoting peaceful coexistence among neighbouring communities.

Oyo NUT suspends strike, directs teachers to resume work

The Nigeria Union of Teachers (NUT) Wednesday announced the suspension of its withdrawal of services across Oyo state public schools.

NUT in a statement jointly signed by the union's Oyo state chairman, Hassan Ajibola Fatai, and secretary, Olukayode Salami, said the suspension was as a result of renewed engagements with the state government and assurances over measures to improve security after the abduction of teachers and learners in Oriire local government area.

The statement added that the suspension followed a directive from its national leadership after reviewing

the prevailing security situation and considering appeals by the Oyo state government and other key stakeholders.

Oyo NUT in the statement directed all public primary and secondary school teachers across the state to resume official duties from Thursday, July 2, 2026, bringing an end to the industrial action that was declared in response to the kidnapping of teachers and students in Oriire local government area."

It stated that the decision was taken in the collective interest of teachers, learners and the general public after the government assured the union that sustained efforts were underway to secure the safe release of the abducted victims and strengthen security around schools

and surrounding communities.

NUT added that Oyo state government had made several commitments aimed at preventing future attacks, including intensified rescue efforts for the abducted teachers and learners, the establishment of a well-equipped Joint Security Task Force to patrol vulnerable schools and access routes, continuous engagement with affected families, psychosocial support and rehabilitation for rescued victims, and payment of gratuities and other entitlements to the families of deceased teachers.

The statement added that other commitments include strengthening the Safe School Initiative through public sensitisation and early warning systems, improving emergency

response mechanisms, addressing criminal hideouts, upgrading school infrastructure, tackling illegal mining and open grazing in forest reserves, enhancing community intelligence gathering, ensuring speedy prosecution of criminal suspects, improving the welfare of security personnel and deploying technology to bolster school security.

The union lauded its members, as well as the All Nigeria Confederation of Principals of Secondary Schools (ANCOPSS) and the Association of Primary School Head Teachers of Nigeria (AOPSHON), for their discipline, solidarity and compliance throughout the period of the industrial action, describing their support as instrumental in advancing the welfare and security of teachers and learners.

DNEMIS: FG urges states, private schools to key into National Education Database

The federal government has urged state governments, local government authorities and private school owners to participate in the Digitalised Nigeria Education Management Information System (DNEMIS).

The digital platform provides detailed information on classrooms, teachers, enrollment, computer facilities, water, sanitation and hygiene infrastructure, as well as other indicators needed for effective monitoring and supervision.

Speaking Wednesday in Abuja

during the official launch of DNEMIS, Minister of Education, Dr Maruf Tunji Alausa, stated that quality education reforms could only succeed when backed by credible and comprehensive data.

Alausa said the digital platform will transform the way education data is collected, analysed and utilised, enabling governments at all levels to monitor schools, identify gaps and deploy resources where they are most needed.

He commended development partners, including the World Bank, the European Union, the Norwegian

Government, UNICEF and other international organisations, for supporting the federal government in developing the new education data infrastructure.

Alausa stated that the implementation of the platform experienced delays before development partners stepped in to accelerate its rollout.

He said the government would continue strengthening collaboration with development partners to ensure that the platform remains functional, inclusive and beneficial to every level of the education sector.

Addressing private school proprietors,

Alausa urged them to upload their data onto the national platform, assuring them that the exercise was not intended for taxation but to improve education planning.

The minister noted that private schools now account for a significant share of basic education in Nigeria and that their inclusion in the national database is essential for informed decision-making.

Alausa further said education commissioners, local government education authorities and school administrators would be able to access real-time information to support evidence-based decisions and improve service delivery.

The minister added the platform currently contains data from about 90,000 public schools, with ongoing efforts to ensure complete coverage of both public and private institutions.

He stated that Nigeria’s education sector serves more than 50 million learners, making accurate and timely data indispensable for national planning.

Alausa also called on state governments to intensify awareness campaigns and mobilise schools within their jurisdictions to participate in the exercise, while pledging continuous engagement with stakeholders to improve data quality and expand the system’s coverage.

The director-general of the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), Semiu Adeyemi Adeniran, pledged the agency’s full support for DNEMIS, saying it is the country’s single, reliable source of education data.

NDC uploads Obi’s nomination particulars to INEC portal

The Nigeria Democratic Congress (ADC) has uploaded the particulars of its presidential candidate, Peter Obi, to the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) portal.

The national leader of the NDC, Seriake Dickson, made this known on his ‘X’ handle.

In the post, Dickson said: “The name of the vice presidential candidate would be uploaded after the completion of the required documentation, while the submission of candidates for other elective positions was also ongoing.”

He said the party had complied with the INEC timetable and noted that there was sufficient time to upload the names of candidates for the National Assembly, governorship

and state Houses of Assembly before the respective deadlines.

Dickson also stated that the NDC had filed an appeal against a court ruling affecting the party, alongside an application for a stay of execution, adding that both had been served on the INEC chairman with a request for the commission to act in accordance with the law. He maintained that the NDC remained a duly registered political party, adding that it had already concluded its nomination processes nationwide through primaries monitored by INEC.

He said what remains is the administrative process of submitting the names of qualified candidates through the commission’s portal, to which the party has already been

granted access.

The former Bayelsa governor thanked party aspirants for their participation in the primaries, acknowledging that although the process was not without challenges, efforts were ongoing to reconcile aggrieved members.

He assured unsuccessful aspirants that they would be accommodated in the party’s campaign structures and committees, describing them as the backbone of the NDC.

Dickson also commended INEC, led by Joash Amupitan, for what he described as its professionalism, particularly in registering the NDC and two other political parties in compliance with a court order.

Ebonyi ready for State Police, says Neighborhood Watch commander

He stated that recruitment and training must be handled professionally, warning against reducing the exercise to mere physical drills.

He advised governments to engage experts in criminology, security studies and other relevant fields to properly

train personnel in intelligence gathering, counter-terrorism, human rights and lawful enforcement procedures.

“The training should not just be about jogging on the field. There are technical areas in criminology and security studies that these personnel must understand. They should know the law, understand re-victimisation, human rights and proper handling of suspects because they are going to be law enforcement officers,” he said.

Court reserves judgement in INEC appeals over 2027 electoral guidelines

The Abuja Division of the Court of Appeal Wednesday reserved judgements in two separate appeals over the timetable for the conduct of the 2027 elections released by the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC).

The lead judge, Adebukola Bankole, who led the panel of the appellate justices that heard the appeal, took the decision.

The date of the judgement, according to her, will be communicated to parties in the appeal.

Two political parties, Youth Party of Nigeria (YPN) and Social Democratic Party (SDP), had approached two Federal High Courts in Abuja to nullify the timetable released for the 2027 elections by INEC.

While Justice Mohammed Umar of the Federal High Court granted the reliefs sought in the suit by YPN and nullified the election guidelines by INEC, Justice James Omotosho, in the suit filed by SDP, granted some reliefs in favour of the party and some others in favour of the electoral umpire.

Not satisfied by the two judgements, INEC approached the Court of Appeal to set aside the judgments of Justice Umar and part of the judgement of Justice Omotosho, which limited INEC's power regarding the conduct of elections.

During the hearing of the appeals, Dr Alex Izinyon, SAN, led two other SANs, from INEC, to argue the appeals.

The second appeal was filed by SDP in a judgement delivered by Justice James Omotosho, who granted some reliefs to the SDP and granted some also to the INEC.

Before the main appeal was argued, Dr Izinyon moved three applications, one of which urged the court to close the door against YPN on the ground that the party failed to file its respondent brief after service of the appellant briefs on them five days earlier.

The YPN counsel, Akinwale Irokosun, when asked by the panel, if the party filed any response to the motion, answered in the negative.

The lead counsel later moved his application, and the court reserved ruling to be delivered alongside the main appeal.

INEC set to introduce downloadable PVCs, full online voter registration

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) is set to introduce "downloadable Permanent Voter Cards (PVCs)" for voters who have misplaced or defaced their original cards.

The INEC Chairman, Joash Amupitan, disclosed this when he received the Director-General of the National Orientation Agency (NOA), Lanre Issa-Onilu, who paid a courtesy visit to the commission's headquarters in Abuja on Wednesday.

Mr Amupitan explained that the new technology was part of ongoing efforts to modernise Nigeria's electoral processes ahead of the 2027 general elections.

According to him, the downloadable PVC option will not be automatic or open to firm-time registrants who have never collected a physical card.

"It is not every PVC that is downloadable. You must have gotten your PVC before, and it must be that the PVC is lost, defaced or if you cannot read your numbers there," he stated.

He further stated that affected voters must formally lodge a complaint at least 90 days before an election to enable the commission to process the replacement.

Mr Amupitan said the commission would pilot the downloadable PVC technology during the off-cycle Osun governorship election in August.

He also disclosed that INEC was

finalising work on a technology that would allow eligible citizens to complete their voter registration entirely online without visiting INEC offices for physical biometric capture.

"We have also been working on the technology that is going to make

it possible for the registration of voters online without even having to visit INEC local government or registration areas.

"So hopefully in the next few days, we will be testing it as soon as the commission approves it," he said.

Mr Amupitan said that those advancements were aimed at eliminating the feeling of disenfranchisement among citizens and ensuring that everyone who desired to register could do so seamlessly. (NAN)

...Commission to deploy BVAS to Osun polling units for Aug. 15 guber

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has said it will provide additional 664 Bimodal Voter Accreditation System (BVAS) as backups to the 3,763 devices to be deployed across all 3,763 polling units for August 15 governorship election in Osun state.

The purpose, INEC said, is to ensure that only registered voters with valid PVCs are accredited and allowed to vote on Election Day.

Speaking at a press briefing in Osogbo Wednesday, the Resident Electoral Commissioner (REC), Mrs. Oluwatoyin Babalola, said the BVAS will be used to upload polling unit results directly to INEC's Result Viewing Portal (IREV) to

enhance transparency and give the public access to polling unit (PU) results.

Babalola also assured that all BVAS devices are already charged and will be configured close to election.

INEC said it has conducted strategic, inclusive sensitisation for women, youth and persons with disabilities (PWDs), faith-based and religious groups, and community-based NGOs to local government areas.

The commission added that it has provided election-related support materials and services, including magnifying glasses, braille ballot guides, and priority voting access for PWDs, the elderly, and nursing mothers.

Babalola said the Osun state Commissioner of Police, CP Ibrahim

Gotan, has assured stakeholders that comprehensive security arrangements are in place to prevent violence and ensure a peaceful environment before, during, and after the election.

She said the DIG in charge of ICT supervising the South west zone, held another Strategic Stakeholders' Security Meeting on 26th June, 2026, where security resolutions were made for Osun.

INEC stated that Osun had 1,954,800 registered voters before the CVR exercise, and promised that voters will be informed when it is time to collect their PVCs.

The REC further said over 80 percent of non-sensitive election materials have been received, and that transport unions have been engaged to ensure INEC logistics reach polling units before voting begins.

Powered by renewables: The world is paying attention, you should too

There is a shift happening, and it is a good one, one that is set to help Nigeria achieve its industrial and \$1 trillion ambition.

Around the world, energy systems are being redesigned at extraordinary speed. Renewable power capacity is expanding faster than at any point in history, with solar leading the charge. Demand is also changing. The drivers of power consumption are no longer just households and traditional industries, but now include electric mobility, cloud computing, data centers and manufacturers.

The world is not just watching, it is putting its money where attention is deserved. There is a growing wave of investments and funding backing Nigeria's renewable energy push.

The federal government, through the Rural Electrification Agency (REA), is leading the charge in partnership with private investors and development partners, all backed by an enabling policy environment.

In Niger State recently, the state government officially handed over 500 hectares of land for the development of a 200MW solar power project that will power Abuja Steel Mills. This 200MW solar-powered industrial energy project is not just about generating electricity; it is about creating a model for how renewable energy can directly support industrial growth, local manufacturing, job creation, and economic transformation.

Similarly, the UNDP under its Africa Minigrids Program (AMP), with funding from the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and in partnership with RMI, the African Development Bank, and the REA has invested over \$5.9 million across 23 separate sites in Nigeria. This funding is particularly interesting as it specifically aims to support women and position them as leaders in the race to achieve sustainable energy. This injected funding is expected to mitigate approximately 74,000 metric tons of CO₂ over the lifetime of the mini-grid investments by replacing diesel and fuelwood with solar energy. It has also transformed the lives and businesses of over 20,000 people.

Furthermore, the International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, in partnership with Norfund, the Norwegian Investment Fund for developing countries through a financing of up to \$83.2m is backing five Renewable Energy Service Companies (RESCOs); Darway Coast Nigeria Limited, GVE Projects Limited, Prado Power Limited, PriVida Power Limited, and StarTimes Energy to expand last-mile power access in communities that remain disconnected from the national grid. This funding also includes \$35.3m in concessional debt drawn from the IDA Private Sector Window Blended Finance Facility and IFC's Concessional Capital Window. Together, these initiatives represent an estimated capital expenditure of \$271 million, which will fund the deployment of 315 solar hybrid mini-grid sites and connect 2.9 million people to clean electricity.

In the private sector, companies like Sun King see the renewable energy space in Nigeria as not just critical, but highly commercially viable. In May 2025, Sun King, in partnership with the International Finance Corporation (IFC) of the World Bank Group and Stanbic IBTC Bank, secured an \$80 million, fully Naira-denominated loan facility to scale access to off-grid solar energy in Nigeria. The investment aligns with Nigeria's Country Partnership Framework with the World Bank Group and contributes to Mission 300, a joint initiative launched with the African Development Bank in 2025 to expand electricity access across Africa.

Commenting at the time, Anish Thakkar, Co-Founder of Sun King, said, "Off-grid solar provides the fastest and most scalable pathway to universal electrification across Africa."

This collaborative momentum is further mirrored by targeted facilities from players like First City Monument Bank (FCMB), which launched a massive \$188 million Green Finance Facility alongside the REA to support broader sustainable infrastructure. FCMB had also earlier launched a \$100bn dual currency funding to support renewable energy expansion across Nigeria.

Other commercial banks like Lotus Bank have also partnered with the REA to launch a dedicated \$100billion facility interest free renewable energy financing ensuring that market-tailored credit reaches underserved communities.

More recently, WeLight, arguably Africa's largest rural electrification company, openly declared that it will be investing in Nigeria by 2027. Backed by €27 million in funding from the IFC, this reinforces an earlier Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the REA to deploy and operate 400 mini-grids and 50 MetroGrids in Nigeria by 2030.

The REA is not attempting to solve every power challenge everywhere at the same time. The agency is prioritizing locations where reliable power can quickly translate into productivity and revenue, enabling it to embark on more projects to fast-track energy access. This is the thinking behind the federal government's "Electricity Growth Zones" areas where electricity supply, economic demand, infrastructure investment, and private capital are deliberately aligned.

The speed of these investments shows us that distributed energy can move faster than traditional infrastructure when economics, enabling policy environments, and technology align. Solar-plus-storage, embedded generation, and dedicated renewable infrastructure can support our \$1 trillion ambition and spark an industrial wave in ways that conventional grid supply alone may struggle to deliver in the short term.

Speaking recently at the LCCI Renewable Energy Outlook Conference, Dr. Abba Aliyu, the Managing Director of the REA, stated, "If Nigeria creates predictable pipelines of mini-grids, public-sector solarization, embedded generation, industrial solar systems, and large

National Grid: NISO knocks APGC over 'Misleading' report on Lagos voltage mishap

The Management of the Nigerian Independent System Operator (NISO) has debunked a publication by the Association of Power Generation Companies (APGC) regarding the June 25, 2026, national grid disturbance, describing it as a "misleading interpretation" of operational realities.

In a statement released Friday, NISO clarified that the grid event was merely a localized voltage instability incident in the Lagos region, which was promptly contained by the System Operator, preventing any nationwide collapse.

NISO slammed the APGC for presenting isolated minimum or

maximum frequency values during the disturbance out of context, noting that temporary fluctuations are fully anticipated and managed under the Nigerian Grid Code.

It is therefore technically incorrect to conclude that the occurrence of temporary frequency or voltage excursions during a disturbance is, in itself, evidence of system failure," NISO stated.

The agency explained that the normal operating frequency range sits between 49.75\text{ Hz} and 50.25\text{ Hz}, but generating units are legally required to remain synchronized during temporary excursions between 47.50\text{ Hz} and 51.50\text{ Hz} for up to 15 seconds to support grid stability.

NISO further explained that the

ALTON backs local Smartphone production to deepen digital inclusion

The Association of Licensed Telecommunications Operators of Nigeria (ALTON) has endorsed the Nigerian Communications Commission's (NCC) call for local smartphone manufacturing, describing the initiative as a critical step toward expanding broadband access, deepening digital inclusion and strengthening Nigeria's digital economy.

ALTON said local production of smartphones would not only make devices more affordable for millions of Nigerians but also stimulate industrial growth, create jobs and position the country as a technology manufacturing hub in Africa.

Speaking with journalists on Saturday, ALTON Chairman, Gbenga Adebayo, reacted to recent remarks by the Chairman of the NCC Board, Idris Olorunnimbe, who had advocated local smartphone production and innovative financing models as solutions to Nigeria's digital inclusion challenge.

According to Adebayo, Nigeria must deliberately shift from being primarily a consumer of technology to becoming a producer and exporter of digital

technologies.

He noted that with one of Africa's largest telecommunications markets and a rapidly growing youthful population, Nigeria possesses the market size and human capital required to support globally competitive technology manufacturing.

Adebayo stressed that the country's aspirations should go beyond assembling imported components into finished devices.

"Our ambition should extend beyond assembling devices. We must pursue genuine knowledge transfer, research and development, product engineering, software development, semiconductor capabilities and large-scale manufacturing," he said.

He added that Nigeria should aim to manufacture smartphones and other digital technologies not only for domestic consumption but also for export to African and international markets.

The ALTON chairman also highlighted the transformative role of artificial intelligence (AI) in modern manufacturing, saying the technology presents a significant opportunity for Nigeria to become more competitive.

According to him, AI is reshaping product design, manufacturing processes, quality

assurance, supply chain management, customer service and software innovation.

He said investment in AI-powered manufacturing would improve productivity, create high-value employment opportunities and enhance Nigeria's competitiveness within the global technology industry.

Adebayo also identified the proliferation of counterfeit and non-type-approved devices as a major challenge confronting Nigeria's telecommunications sector.

The endorsement follows comments by NCC Board Chairman, Idris Olorunnimbe, during a Digital Africa Summit Roundtable held in Shanghai, China, where he identified smartphone affordability—not network coverage or data costs—as Nigeria's biggest remaining obstacle to digital inclusion.

Olorunnimbe described affordable smartphones as the "new on-ramp" to essential services such as education, healthcare, financial inclusion, e-commerce and digital government services.

He called for coordinated efforts involving local manufacturing, trusted devices, consumer financing and supportive government policies to accelerate broadband penetration and unlock the full potential of Nigeria's digital economy.

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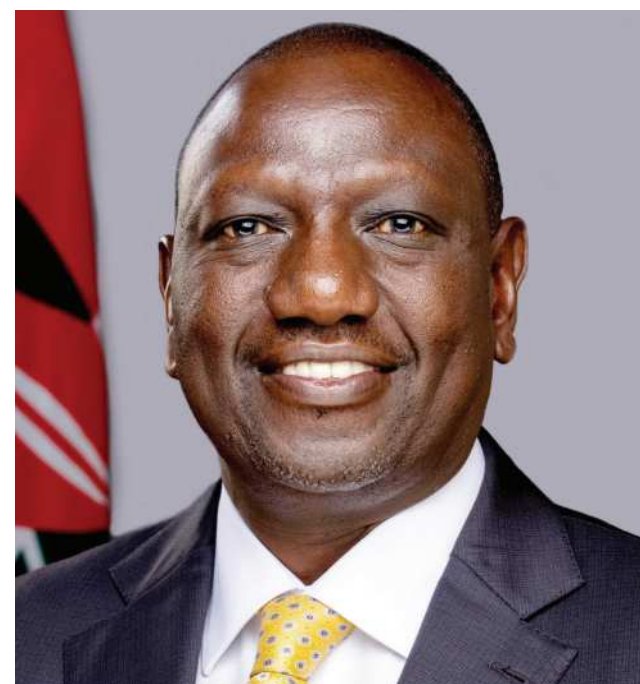
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Africa's security at a crossroad

There was a time when Africa was often portrayed as standing at the margins of international politics with its conflicts treated as regional crises, its development challenges largely divorced from the wider currents shaping the global order. That perception no longer holds.

Today, almost every major geopolitical fault line has an African dimension. The war in Ukraine has disrupted food supplies across the continent. The conflict in the Middle East has fuelled energy price volatility and redirected diplomatic attention away from Africa's own crises. Competition among the United States, China and Russia has expanded into African capitals, while new players from the Gulf states to Türkiye are steadily enlarging their political, economic and military footprints.

At the same time, Africa itself has become indispensable to the world economy. Its critical minerals are essential for the global transition to renewable energy and digital technologies. Its rapidly growing population will shape future labour markets and consumer demand. Its strategic waterways remain vital to international trade. Far from being peripheral, Africa now occupies a central place in the emerging geopolitical landscape.

Yet this growing strategic importance coincides with a period of exceptional uncertainty.

The international institutions created after the Second World War are struggling to cope with multiplying crises. Great-power rivalry has returned with unexpected intensity. Development assistance is becoming more selective, sovereign debt continues to constrain economic growth, and climate change is accelerating competition over land, water and livelihoods. At precisely the moment when Africa requires stronger international cooperation, the multilateral system itself is

showing unmistakable signs of strain.

Against this backdrop, policymakers, diplomats, military practitioners and scholars gathered at the University of Pretoria in South Africa in May 2026 to examine one of the defining questions of how can Africa strengthen its own security in an increasingly fragmented world

The discussions, summarised in the policy brief *Africa's Security Challenges in a Turbulent World*, reached a sobering conclusion. The international environment that shaped Africa's peace and security efforts during the three decades following the Cold War is rapidly disappearing.

The real challenge is whether African institutions can evolve quickly enough to keep pace with a world in which the geopolitical landscape is changing faster than at any time since the end of the Cold War.

Pax Africana faces new reality

More than half a century ago, the Kenyan scholar Ali Mazrui coined the expression *Pax Africana* to describe an ambitious vision that Africa's peace should ultimately be secured by Africans themselves rather than guaranteed by external powers.

Mazrui argued that lasting peace could not be imposed. It had to grow from African institutions, African diplomacy and African political leadership. Decades later, that vision remains as compelling as ever. Yet it has become immeasurably more difficult to achieve.

Today's security landscape bears little resemblance to the one that existed when the African Union replaced the Organisation of African Unity in 2002. The continent now confronts an extraordinary convergence of traditional conflicts and emerging threats.

Military coups have returned to parts of West Africa, reversing years of democratic progress. Violent extremist organisations continue to exploit fragile

governance across the Sahel, the Lake Chad Basin, Somalia and northern Mozambique. Sudan has descended into one of the world's gravest humanitarian catastrophes, displacing millions of people and destabilising an already volatile region. In the eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, cycles of violence continue to draw in neighbouring states, armed militias and competing economic interests centred on some of the world's most valuable critical minerals.

These crises are no longer isolated emergencies. They increasingly overlap, reinforcing one another through illicit arms trafficking, organised crime, forced migration, food insecurity and environmental stress. Internal fragility is compounded by external competition as major powers pursue strategic influence across the continent through military cooperation, investment, diplomatic engagement and resource partnerships.

The result is a security environment that is far more complex than the one African policymakers confronted even a decade ago.

The Pretoria dialogue captured this changing reality with unusual clarity. Participants observed that conflicts far beyond Africa's borders are now profoundly shaping the continent's security prospects. The wars in Ukraine and the Middle East have not only disrupted grain supplies and energy markets but have also diverted international attention, financial resources and diplomatic energy away from African peace initiatives.

Instead of viewing the continent primarily as a development partner, many external powers now approach Africa through the prism of strategic rivalry. Critical minerals, maritime routes, migration management, counter-terrorism cooperation and military access have assumed increasing importance in shaping international

relations.

The wider range of external partners gives them greater diplomatic flexibility than at any point since the Cold War. At the same time, it demands a higher level of political coordination if Africa is to avoid becoming merely another arena in which global powers compete for influence.

When global governance falters

If Africa's security challenges have grown more complex, so too has the international system meant to address them.

For much of the post-Cold War era, the United Nations served as the ultimate framework for managing African conflicts. From Namibia and Mozambique to Liberia, Sierra Leone and Côte d'Ivoire, UN peacekeeping became an indispensable instrument for stabilising societies emerging from war. However imperfect these missions were, they reflected a broad international consensus that peacekeeping was a shared global responsibility.

Today, the United Nations Security Council finds itself increasingly immobilised by the geopolitical rivalries of its five permanent members. Disagreements over Ukraine, Gaza and wider strategic competition have spilt into discussions on Africa, making consensus on conflict resolution progressively more elusive. Diplomatic deadlock has become almost routine, with humanitarian considerations frequently overshadowed by competing national interests. The consequences are felt most acutely in Africa.

Conflicts in Sudan, the Eastern Democratic Republic of Congo and the Sahel demand coordinated international responses, yet the institutions designed to provide such leadership are struggling to act decisively. The Pretoria dialogue concluded that the Security Council's paralysis has become one

of the principal obstacles to effective conflict management on the continent.

Ironically, African voices within the Council have become more important precisely as the institution itself has become less effective.

Building African capacity, not African dependence

The growing emphasis on African-led security should not be mistaken for a retreat from international cooperation—quite the opposite.

The Pretoria discussions repeatedly underscored that collaboration between the United Nations, the African Union and regional organisations remains indispensable. No single institution possesses all the political legitimacy, operational capability and financial resources needed to address today's increasingly complex conflicts.

The challenge is therefore not to replace one actor with another. It is to create a more balanced partnership in which Africa exercises greater strategic leadership while external partners provide support that strengthens, rather than substitutes for, African institutions.

That distinction is crucial. For too long, international assistance has often focused on responding to crises after violence has erupted. The next phase of African security must place equal emphasis on prevention: strengthening governance, improving early-warning mechanisms, investing in mediation and enabling regional organisations to intervene before local tensions escalate into prolonged wars.

A New Scramble—or a New Opportunity?

Africa has always attracted outside powers. During the colonial era, the continent was carved up in pursuit of territory and resources. Throughout the Cold War, it became an arena where East and West competed

for ideological influence.

Today, another contest is unfolding, but this time the players are more numerous, the interests more diverse and the rules far less clear.

Unlike previous eras, today's geopolitical competition cannot be reduced to a simple East-West divide.

The United States remains deeply engaged through diplomacy, counter-terrorism cooperation and private investment. China has become Africa's largest trading partner and a major financier of infrastructure projects.

Russia has expanded security partnerships and arms exports while strengthening political ties with several governments. Türkiye has emerged as an increasingly important supplier of defence equipment and development assistance.

Meanwhile, the Gulf states, notably the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia and Qatar, have significantly increased investments in ports, agriculture, energy and logistics while assuming more active diplomatic roles across the Horn of Africa and the Sahel. Each of these relationships offers potential benefits. Each also carries strategic risks.

Unlike during the Cold War, African governments now have considerably greater room to diversify their international partnerships. Rather than relying overwhelmingly on a single bloc, many countries have pursued what might be described as strategic multi-alignment—working simultaneously with different partners in line with their national interests.

The challenge for Africa is therefore not to choose between Washington and Beijing, Moscow and Brussels, or Ankara and Abu Dhabi. It is to ensure that these relationships advance African priorities rather than external agendas. That requires stronger continental coordination than currently exists.

Power minister calls for shared accountability, protection of power assets

The Minister of Power, Mr Joseph Tegbe, has outlined his Ministerial Action Plan for the stabilization and growth of Nigeria's electricity sector.

He made this known at the second quarterly Nigerian Electricity Supply Industry (NESI) Stakeholders Meeting recently convened by the Nigerian Electricity Regulatory Commission (NERC) Sunday in Abuja.

The forum, which was Chaired by the Chairman of NERC, Dr Musiliu Oseni, featured power sector stakeholders including operators, regulators and policy actors and had in attendance the Special Adviser to the President on Power, Mr Rilwan Lanre Babalola, and the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Power, Alh Mahmud Mamman.

Delivering the keynote address, the Minister framed his plans around a core conviction that Nigeria's electricity crisis demands collective ownership of the entire value chain. "Nigeria's power crisis was not built by one hand, and it will not be fixed by one hand," he said, calling on GenCos, DisCos, TCN, NISO, regulators, and government to accept shared responsibility for both the depth of the problem and the discipline of the solution.

On infrastructure, Tegbe called for power assets to be formally designated and treated as Critical National Assets, describing vandalism, grid sabotage, and energy theft as economic warfare against ordinary Nigerian households. He added that securing existing assets must run concurrently with optimizing their output, with transmission weak points, spinning reserves, and priority substation relays all being actively addressed to improve near-term grid reliability.

Coalition tasks NASS, Tinubu on Audit Service Bill

A coalition of civil society groups led by the Centre for Social Justice (CSJ), has called on the leadership of the National Assembly to engage President Bola Ahmed Tinubu over his continued withholding of assent to the Federal Audit Service Bill, months after it was transmitted to him for signing.

In a letter addressed to the Senate President, Godswill Akpabio, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and other principal officers of the National Assembly,

the Lead Director of CSJ, Eze Onyekpere, said the President had neither assented to the Bill nor made public any communication stating his reasons for declining to sign it.

According to the letter: "the Bill seeks to introduce institutional independence for the audit function, expand audit scope, strengthen enforcement powers, and align Nigeria's audit framework with international standards."

The coalition described presidential assent to the Bill as critical for improving fiscal discipline, reducing corruption, and enhancing public

sector performance.

Onyekpere urged the National Assembly to find out from the President why he has withheld assent and, where necessary, rectify any errors identified. Alternatively, he said, "Lawmakers should invoke Section 58(5) of the 1999 Constitution (as amended) to override the President's veto by a two-thirds majority vote, if they remain convinced the Bill as passed serves the national interest."

The coalition noted that the extant Audit Ordinance of 1956 ceased to be part of Nigerian law following the Revised Edition (Laws of the

Federation of Nigeria) Decree of 1990, and was not reproduced in the 2004 Laws of the Federation, leaving Nigeria without a substantive federal audit law outside constitutional provisions.

The letter further recalled that the Federal Audit Service Bill had previously been passed by the National Assembly under Presidents Olusegun Obasanjo, Goodluck Jonathan, and Muhammadu Buhari, but was denied assent each time without further legislative pushback. The coalition urged the 10th National Assembly to break the pattern and provide leadership on audit reform.

Nigeria's private sector growth slows on cost pressures concerns – PMI

Nigeria's private sector growth slowed in June as the headline purchasing managers' index (PMI) declined to 53.4 in June, down slightly from May's reading of 54.1, according to S&P Global/Stanbic IBTC report for June.

According to June Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) report, improving demand conditions helped to support further increases in output and new orders in Nigeria's private sector at the midway point of the year.

Rising workloads and the prospect of further growth in the months ahead meant that firms took on additional staff and raised both purchasing activity and inventory

holdings, the report stated, according to MarketForce.

The PMI report captured that input costs and output prices increased sharply again, albeit to a lesser extent than immediately following the outbreak of war in the Middle East.

The headline PMI posted 53.4 in June, down slightly from May's reading of 54.1, but still above the 50.0 no-change mark and signalling a solid monthly improvement in business conditions at the end of the second quarter.

The health of the private sector has now strengthened in five successive months. Panellists often reported improving customer demand in June. This, alongside the introduction of new products, helped lead to a further marked rise in sales volumes.

With new orders up and companies expanding their operations, output also increased. In both cases, however, rates of growth were softer than seen in May.

Business activity expanded across three of the four broad sectors covered by the survey, the exception being manufacturing. Companies were also optimistic that output will rise over the coming year, and sentiment improved markedly to the strongest since June 2025.

Advertising efforts, business expansion plans and stockpiling were among the factors supporting confidence, according to respondents. Improving customer demand and confidence in the year ahead outlook encouraged companies to expand their staffing levels, purchasing activity and inventories in June.

S/Africa trade slips into deficit as exports weaken amid xenophobic backlash

Apapa Port Customs intercepts N53.39bn counterfeit NAFDAC-approved drugs, others

Counterfeit labelled medicines, The Nigeria Customs Service (NCS) has intercepted fake NAFDAC-labelled medicines, illicit drugs and expired pharmaceutical products with a combined Duty Paid Value (DPV) of N53.39 billion estimate have been intercepted by the Nigeria Customs Service Apapa port command in Lagos.

The NCS said the development is part of its commitment to flush out illegal substances and protect the citizens from consuming substandard products that constitute health hazards to public health and national security.

At the handover of the seized products in Lagos on Wednesday, Comptroller-General of Customs, Bashir Adewale Adeniyi, disclosed that the breakthrough followed painstaking intelligence gathering, scanning, analysis, physical examination and close teamwork with the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA).

The confiscated items are over 6.7 tonnes of Cannabis Sativa (Canadian Loud) concealed in two 40-foot containers stalked among imported vehicles and automobile spare parts, 339,800 bottles of Codeine syrup, containers of expired pharmaceutical products, Piccan Teething Powder, and fake NAFDAC-labelled medicines.

According to him, a consignment contained 1,100 packages of CHACOLD Chlorpheniramine Maleate Capsules bearing a fake NAFDAC registration number and a false expiry date.

"The use of a fake registration number and supporting documentation clearly indicates a deliberate attempt to smuggle unregistered pharmaceutical products into the Nigerian market, thereby posing a serious risk to public health."

3 die in Mexico World Cup celebrations

Three people died from suffocation as thousands of fans crowded Mexico City streets during World Cup celebrations, the capital's health secretariat said in the early hours of Wednesday.

The deaths occurred near the Angel of Independence landmark, where thousands of soccer fans had gathered to celebrate Mexico's 2-0 victory over Ecuador in the round of 32.

Emergency teams tended to three unconscious people at different locations around Paseo de la Reforma, authorities said.

The capital's most emblematic boulevard and the streets around it had been closed to traffic and set up for the soccer celebrations.

"After receiving advanced resuscitation efforts, the deaths of a 44-year-old man



and a 19-year-old woman from suffocation have been confirmed," the health authority initially said on social media.

The third fatality was a 48-year-old woman who was treated on a nearby street after suffering asphyxiation and died after being taken to hospital, the secretariat added in a later post.

Mayor Clara Brugada expressed her condolences to

the families of the victims on X and urged everyone to "always celebrate with responsibility, care, and empathy".

Mexicans took to the streets to celebrate after the national team ended a 40-year wait for a World Cup knockout victory at the Azteca Stadium in the capital, with the win against Ecuador sending the co-hosts into the last 16.

Williams' knee injury leaves Wimbledon doubles in doubt

Serena Williams' hopes of playing alongside older sister Venus in the Wimbledon doubles look in doubt after she injured her knee in her singles comeback.

The pair, who are six-time doubles champions at the All England Club, are due to reunite on a Grand Slam court for the first time since 2022 on Friday.

However, 44-year-old Serena Williams might not be fit enough to play after her knee swelled up during her defeat by Australia's Maya Joint on Tuesday.

The 23-time Grand Slam singles champion did not speak to the media following the match, with Wimbledon organisers saying she was "not able to undertake" her duties.

"Serena tweaked her right knee at the end of the first set and was therefore excused from her media obligations by the Wimbledon and



WTA medical teams," said Williams' agent Jill Smoller.

"She left site that night unaided and is doing everything she can to be ready for her doubles match later this week."

Missing the doubles would be a hugely-disappointing ending to Williams' highly-anticipated return to the All England Club.

The American superstar has been the centre of the

attention in SW19 over the past few days, with a high level of intrigue about why she was coming back and how she would look on court.

Williams played what she thought would be the final match of her career at the 2022 US Open, but tellingly refused to use the word 'retirement' and instead said she was "evolving away" from tennis.

Itauma ordered to hold talks over IBF title fight

Briton Moses Itauma has been ordered by the IBF to hold talks with Cuba's Frank Sanchez about fighting for the vacant heavyweight title.

Last week Oleksandr Usyk relinquished his IBF, WBA 'super' and WBC belts.

The IBF said that, "in accordance with IBF championship rules", it wants Sanchez, who is number one in their heavyweight rankings, to fight number three contender Itauma.

It said they have until 29 July to reach an agreement.

Itauma, 21, is scheduled to fight Croatia's Filip Hrgovic at London's O2 Arena on 29 August in what he has called his "toughest fight".

He could pull out of the Hrgovic fight or agree to fight Sanchez after that bout.

BBC Sport has contacted



Itauma's promoter Queensberry for comment.

Itauma claimed an impressive fifth-round stoppage over Jermaine Franklin in Manchester in March.

Although the IBF wants to arrange a bout for the vacant title, the WBC upgraded

interim champion AgitKabayel to champion after Usyk gave up its belt.

Two-time undisputed heavyweight champion Usyk, who was required to fight German Kabayel after he was granted an exemption to fight Rico Verhoeven in May, is now free to fight any opponent.

FIFA says World Cup sees 13-fold surge in online abuse, 11% racially motivated

FIFA's digital watchdogs uncovered 89,000 abusive posts on social media during the group stage of the World Cup, marking a 13-fold increase from the 2022 edition in Qatar, world soccer's governing body said on Wednesday.

The alarming spike was recorded after FIFA's Social Media Protection Service (SMPS) scanned over six million posts and comments -- a 33% jump from 2022 -- with racial abuse accounting for 11% of all detected offensive messages.

The share of racially motivated attacks represents a 3% rise compared to the group stage in Qatar, with FIFA saying it marked a "significant increase in the objectively worst, most offensive material" on social media platforms.

"Available to all teams, players, coaches and match officials participating at FIFA tournaments, SMPS



protects them and their followers from experiencing discriminatory and offensive content," FIFA said in a statement.

The SMPS uses a mix of technology and human moderation to detect, filter and block racist, discriminatory or threatening messages, while also protecting players' followers from exposure to abusive content.

FIFA said 225,000 posts were identified for human review, of which moderators verified 89,000 posts as abusive and took action, with approximately 1,000 accounts escalated for further investigation.

The expanded tournament format with 48 teams compared to 32 in Qatar has also played a role in the increased volume of content analysed, FIFA added.

Genesio replaces Beye as Marseille boss



Marseille said on Wednesday Bruno Genesio has replaced Habib Beye as coach of the Ligue 1 club.

Former Aston Villa defender Beye left the position on Tuesday having failed to secure Champions League football in his four months in charge on the Mediterranean coast.

Genesio, 59, left Lille at the end of last season having guided

the northern outfit to the elite European competition.

The managerial debate at Marseille had been put on ice earlier in June after the club were hit with sanctions by UEFA for failing to meet the European football governing body's break-even targets.

"This appointment is part of the new sporting cycle undertaken by the club in order

to pursue its development and sustainably strengthen its competitiveness at the highest level," Marseille said.

"With a wealth of experience gained at both domestic and European level, Bruno Genesio has established himself over the years as one of the most highly regarded French coaches," the 1993 Champions League winners added.

Former midfielder Genesio has also had spells at the helm of Lyon, Rennes and Beijing Guoan in China.

During his time at the Bretons, Genesio was named 2021-2022 French coach of the season having guided the outfit to fourth in the table and the Europa League last 16.

"I chose to join Olympique de Marseille because I was drawn in by the challenge that was presented to me," Genesio said.

Christensen stays at Barca on new 2-year deal

Barcelona have extended Danish defender Andreas Christensen's contract until June 2028, the Spanish champions said Wednesday.

The 30-year-old centre-back, whose previous deal expired at the end of June, has been frequently sidelined by injuries during his time at Camp Nou.

The defender has accepted a significant pay cut to stay at the club, according to Spanish reports.

"FC Barcelona and Andreas Christensen have reached an agreement for the extension of the Danish defender's contract, keeping him at the club until 30 June 2028," Barca said in a statement.

The Denmark international played a key part in Barcelona's LaLiga



triumph in his debut campaign at the club in 2022 after arriving from Chelsea.

Christensen has played

98 times for Barca, winning three LaLiga titles and a Copa del Rey among other trophies.

Tinubu to send-off Team Nigeria to 2026 Commonwealth Games Thursday

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu will on Thursday send off Team Nigeria, ahead of the contingent's departure to the United Kingdom for the 2026 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, Scotland. The send-off event, which will take place at the Presidential Villa, is part of the President's show of support for the Nigerian contingent before they depart the shores of the nation to begin the final phase of preparations before the Games.

The 2026 Commonwealth Games will take place from July 23 to August 2, bringing together athletes from across the Commonwealth to compete for honours in various sporting events.

Egypt optimistic Salah will be fit to face Australia

Egypt remain optimistic the hamstring strain Mohamed Salah picked up against Iran will not prevent him from facing Australia in Friday's last-32 tie at the FIFA World Cup.

Salah suffered the injury in the group game that secured passage to the knockout stage for the Pharaohs, who are making

their fourth appearance at a World Cup.

The North Africans reached the knockout phase for the first time after going unbeaten against Belgium, New Zealand and Iran to finish second in Group G.
